ZI has been providing daily updates during the 16 Days of Activism. The first was a Video and each day more information is forwarded by email. You can also check it out at http://zontasaysno.com Here are some disturbing facts taken from WHO and UN Women:

- Women and girls represent some 55% of the estimated 29.9 million victims of forced labour worldwide
- Women and girls represent 98% of the estimated 4.5 million forced into sexual exploitation; and
- More than 64 million girls worldwide are child brides
- 14 million girls under the age of 18 will be married this year an average of 38,000 child brides per day or 13 every 30 seconds

In an analysis of 18 countries for the safest places for women to live and work Australia rates 4th . The top three countries were Canada, Germany and the United Kingdom. In 2010 the Australian Government Office for Women reported that 19.1% of women experienced sexual violence since the age of 15.
