FORCED/ ARRANGED MARRIAGE, UNDER-AGE MARRIAGE

- * Under laws passed by the Australian government in 2013, it is illegal to coerce, threaten or deceive someone into marriage.
- * Forced marriage is a slavery-like practice, a form of gender-based violence and an abuse of human rights. This situation is not limited to any particular cultural group, religion or ethnicity and it occurs world-wide. Whilst men and boys can be victims of forced marriage, most reported victims are young women and girls.
- * Offences apply regardless of the age, gender or sexual orientation of the victim.
- * A servile marriage is a very specific form of forced marriage. A servile marriage is defined in the Supplementary Convention on the Abolition of Slavery 1956.
- * The Convention on the Rights of the Child says that any person "below the age of 18" is a child.
- * The Crimes Legislation Amendment (Slavery and Slavery-like Conditions and People Trafficking) Bill 2012, Division 270.7A refers.
- * Report ALL cases/suspected cases of forced/arranged marriage to relevant Federal/State authorities
