HONOUR KILLINGS/FEMICIDE

- * Honour killings are the homicide of a member of a family by other members, due to the perpetrator's belief that the victim has brought shame or dishonour upon the family, or has violated the principles of their community or religion.
- * Reasons for honour killings include: refusing to enter an arranged marriage, seeking a divorce or separation, being in a relationship disapproved of by the family, having sex outside marriage, being a victim of rape, dressing in ways deemed inappropriate, engaging in homosexual relations, bringing insufficient dowry to a family.
- * Honour killings are acts of vengeance, usually resulting in death, committed by male family members against female family members.
- * Femicide is a murder committed by a current or former husband/boyfriend- it is also called intimate partner homicide.
- * Forced suicide is sometimes used as a substitute for an honour killing.
- * An average of two women per week are killed by an intimate partner.
- * Every 90 minutes an honour killing is perpetrated somewhere in the world
