<u>CULTURALLY AND LINGUISTICALLY DIVERSE (CALD)</u> <u>WOMEN</u>

- * There are some 275 cultural and ethnic groups recognised in Australia.
- * Women from CALD backgrounds are reluctant to report abuse and often decline to participate in surveys about domestic violence or sexual assault for fear of retribution (a 'cultural' response in many cultures).
- * Practices such as female genital mutilation, forced marriage, honour killings, forced prostitution/trafficking, threatening to marry another wife, refusing spouse to get an education, training or a job, belittling spouse, exercising God-given control over all activities, requiring obedience, marital rape, child marriage, forced suicide, psychological abuse, dowry killing, are 'hidden' or denied in some cultures.
- * Gender inequality is firmly entrenched in many migrants relocating in Australia, and prosecutions against abuses such as the ones listed above, are few (see FGM, forced marriage, honour killings, trafficking statements Days 1,2,3,6).
- * Constraints produced by immigration policies are of significant concern where women depend on perpetrators for economic security and residency rights.
- * Scant evidence is available to indicate that criminal justice responses to family violence such as 'mandatory arrest', and 'pro-prosecution' are helpful for immigrant women, and may deter them from seeking assistance in crisis situations.
