### President's Patter



I think the March meeting is the one meeting in the year that I really enjoy the most. It is a time where we catch up with our young women whom we sponsor with a scholarship. It is always heartening to hear of their achievements for the year and their aspirations. A time to welcome our two new scholarship awardees and then wish those who have completed their course the best for their careers.

As most of us have travelled through our working lives and aspired in our careers, we have met many an obstacle sometime defined by our gender. I know throughout my working career I had many a great mentor who challenged me to go for the next step, the next position... but I also remember times when being a woman defined my supposed lot in life. I remember one day when talking with a school inspector he turned to me saying "Now Jo what do we have to pay you to stay in the classroom?" He then turned to a male colleague put his arm around his shoulders and said "Come let us talk about what we need to do to help you become a principal!!!!".

I suppose my hope for our young women, daughters, granddaughters, nieces and great nieces is that their careers are defined by their abilities and skills and opportunities open for both male and females on an open footing.

#### Why my sermon?

In putting a submission together earlier this month, I pulled out some data on gender parity and women's participation in the workforce.

Despite the significant gains regarding the rights of women and girls, equality and emancipation, progress towards gender parity has slowed worldwide in recent years. In 2015 the World Economic Forum revised its prediction to achieve global gender parity from 2095 to 2133.

In Australia, data from Graduate Careers Australia shows that in 2015:

- The median full-time employment starting salary for women was \$53,000 (up from \$52,000 in 2014), and for men was \$55,000 (unchanged from 2014).
- There was a 3.6% gender pay gap overall. That is, women's earnings were 96.4% of men's earnings (compared to 94.5% in 2014).

## President's Patter (Cont)

Data presented by the Australian Government Workplace Gender Equality Agency indicates:

- Women's average earnings were \$277.70 per week less than men.
- The workforce participation rate for women is 59.5% and for men 71.0%
- The full time average hourly earnings for women are 13.9% less than men's full-time average hourly earnings. (February/March 2016).

We still have some work to do.

## 2016/2017 Service Projects

At our February meeting, we endorsed continuation of our existing projects and confirmed a decision taken earlier that we would commit \$3,500 towards the training of more facilitators to conduct the LoveBites program in more schools this year. Our service projects then are the continuation of our Breast Cushion and Drainage Bag project (funded from an identified account), our scholarships for a graduating student from each of Balmoral and Yeronga State High Schools (plus continuation of existing scholarships awarded) and support for Madonna House, the training of facilitators for LoveBites and using funds previously allocated for the Logan Sexual Response Unit and ZigZag according to their needs. One-third of our funds raised will, as normal, be forwarded to the Zonta International Foundation post the Audit of our accounts.



These will be funded from our fundraising during the 2015-2016 Club year as per our policy with any shortfall supplemented from reserves. It is now up to us as members to determine our fundraising activities for the coming year so that we continue our projects and any new ones that are approved.

The big news this month is that the Club has been successful in obtaining a \$10,000 grant from EPIC Assist to expand the training of facilitators this year to introduce the program in more schools in 2017.

We are having on-going discussions with the Department of Education and NAPCAN on the best way to do this and the timing of the training.

We have also applied for a grant from the Community Benefit Fund, but the outcome of that application will not be known for a few months. Regardless, we can proceed now with the project involving other Clubs who have also committed to the project. Many thanks to Jo who wrote the applications and submitted them on behalf of our Club.

## Breast Cushions

Jo has been busy delivering Breast Cushions and Drainage bags this past month. We do have a supply in stock so our next working bee will be in May (see Date Claimers below).
