Zonta International Conference 2018

In collaboration with the Brisbane Convention and Exhibition Centre, Brisbane Marketing, Brisbane City Council, and Tourism and Events Queensland, District 22 has submitted a bid for consideration of Brisbane as the host city for the 2018 Zonta International Convention.

Zonta International is already committed to hosting the 2018

Convention in the Asia Pacific region and we are confident that the quality of our submission and the 'Team Brisbane' approach will be well regarded and that we have the capacity to deliver an exceptional Convention.

There is stiff competition, but the 94-page bid document prepared by BCEC is of excellent quality, and the submission was enhanced by strong letters of support from more than 10 influential Zontians and other prominent public figures.

The first Australia-based convention was held in Sydney in 1984, the second was in Melbourne in 2006, and if Brisbane wins the 2018 bid, I do hope all D22 Zontians will make a serious effort to attend and that there will be strong representation from every club so that we can welcome the Zonta world not just to Brisbane, but to Australia.
