### **International Dues**

- Members admitted from 1 June through 30 November pay dues for the full year.
- Members admitted from 1 December through 31 May pay dues for one-half year.
- New and charter members pay a special "new member fee" and reinstated members pay a processing fee in addition to the dues.

### Clubs with outstanding dues

- The executive director will notify clubs with outstanding dues, as soon as possible after 45 days from the due date, that the dues are in arrears and that unless their financial obligations are met within 45 days the governor, area director, club president and treasurer will be notified that the club has forfeited its membership.
- The executive director will notify the ZI Board when club dues are unpaid.

### Superannuation

In 2007, (latest data available) 75.7% of all men aged 15 years and over in Australia had superannuation coverage, compared to 66.3% of women aged 15 years and over.

Higher proportions of women and men aged 25 to 54 years had superannuation coverage than people aged 55 years and over.

Across all age groups, a higher proportion of men than women were covered by superannuation.

2.8 million women and 1.6 million men aged 15 years and over reported not being covered by superannuation.

Dear Zontians.

Thanks to the generosity and commitment of Zontians worldwide, Zonta International is making a difference in the lives of women in need around the globe.

The projects funded by the Foundation are producing real results and positive changes in the lives of the women we serve and the communities we reach. The "ending violence against women through community action" project in Cambodia has successfully reached out to more than 10,000 women and men in the community, helping to raise awareness of existing laws regarding violence against women and the legal rights of victims of violence. In Egypt and Syria, survivors of violence are recovering from the incidences of violence in their lives and seeking justice as they receive the medical, psychosocial and legal services they need.

In Rwanda, more than 650 pregnant women have received PMTCT (prevention of mother-to-child transmission) services to prevent the spread of HIV to their children. Twenty-six of the forty-five babies born to HIV infected mothers were tested at six weeks, and all of the tests were negative. The Fistula Project in Liberia was able to perform surgeries for nearly 180 patients with an 89% success rate, and 33 women received rehabilitation and reintegration services before returning to their communities.

Our ability to continue to provide life-changing and life-saving support and services to women in need depends on your continued generosity.

### History

The Birthing Kit Foundation (Australia) was established in September 2006. Previously the Zonta Birthing Kit Committee, a group of individuals operating under the direction of the Zonta Club of the Adelaide Hills Inc, developed and administered the Birthing Kit Project.

The Birthing Kit Foundation (Australia) has become the administration arm of the National Zonta Birthing Kit Project from 2007. Over 100 Zonta Clubs, high schools, midwifery and medical students and community groups raise funds and hold Assembly Days to assemble Zonta Birthing Kits ready to be packaged and posted to their final destinations.

### The Zonta Birthing Kit Project

- 1999 the Zonta Club of Adelaide Hills Inc. assembled and distributed 100 simple birthing kits to women in Milne Bay Province, Papua New Guinea
- 2003 the project was accepted as a Zonta International District 23 project to 2006
- 2004 the project went national with Zonta International District 24 support.
- 2004 a 2 year contract was signed with AusAID to sponsor the Zonta Birthing Kit Project
- July 2004 to August 2005, 93,000 kits were distributed to 26 countries through 17 NGOs.
- 2005 the project was accepted as a Zonta International District 23 and District 24 initiative until 2008
- September 2005 until December 2006, 140,000 kits were distributed to 28 countries through 36 NGOs.
- September 2006 the Birthing Kit Foundation (Australia) was established to administer the Zonta Birthing Kit Project
- 2007 onwards, Zonta Clubs and other project supporters will continue to make Zonta Birthing Kits for the Zonta Birthing Kit Project

The project has been supplying kits to women in developing countries, while also supporting community development and sustainability programs.

### Accreditations

### AusAID Support

In July 2004 a two year contract was signed with AusAID on a dollar for dollar basis, with 50% of Zonta's matched money made up of in volunteer skills and time.

The project grew from supplying PNG with 100 kits in 1999 to supplying over 340,000 kits to 30 countries through over 40 Organizations with financial support from AusAID, Zonta District 23 and 24 clubs, high school students, University students and community groups.

The kits are sent to countries in the Asia, Pacific and Africa region.

### Future

### THE BIRTHING KIT FOUNDATION (AUSTRALIA) aims to:

- Distribute Birthing Kits to women in developing countries to provide for a clean and safe birth.
- Develop health initiatives to provide clean birthing environments in remote communities and to work towards sustainable solutions.
- Administer the Birthing Kit Foundation (Australia) with integrity, efficiency and accountability.
- Produce the quantity of Birthing Kits within the budget and to continue to develop processes to increase the
  project's efficiency and cost effectiveness.
- Raise the awareness of the Birthing Kit Project nationally and globally.

Initially the project was purely a supplier of kits to women in developing countries through Traditionally Midwife Training Programs. It introduced communities and governments to the simple concept of clean basic easily transportable Birthing Kits, and how they could save lives. Now the Birthing Kit Foundation (Australia) will encourage the establishment of Community Development programmes where the government or local community establish their own midwifery training programmes and eventually source their own supplies and make their own kits.

The Foundation will oppose and not be a willing party to wrongdoing, corruption, bribery or other financial impropriety in any of its activities.
