
Overview


Speakers



Virginia Nelson

Virginia's progressive leadership and significant achievements in the public sector were recognised in 2016 when she was awarded the Telstra Business Women's Public Sector and Academia Award. This prestigious award follows many others accumulated over two decades of service to the Queensland Police Service during which Virginia has become a prominent role model for many women seeking leadership opportunities within the organisation and beyond. Virginia is a member of the Rockhampton Zonta Club and a board member of numerous community advisory and sporting committees.

Dr Luc is a pastor, medical doctor and elected member of parliament in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and is known for his community development work and jovial nature. While this would be enough to keep most people busy, Dr Luc has overseen the building of schools and hospitals, started micro-finance initiatives for women, worked with Birthing Kit Foundation Australia to distribute more than 150,000 clean birthing kits and opened a birthing kit distribution centre. He has also personally trained 980 traditional birthing attendants and 36 midwifery trainers who have gone on to train a further 3,000 traditional birthing attendants.

Jenny is the Director of the Birthing Kit Foundation Australia and has an extensive history of outstanding service with Zonta. Her work background ranges from education to the wine making business to finance and Jenny makes excellent use of her corporate, financial and management skills in the non-profit sector. She is the Treasurer of the Mission in Health Care Development Australian Support Association which assists a DR Congo based NGO in their work to reduce poverty by combating chronic and hereditary illness, and infant and maternal morbidity and mortality.
