Board approved to accept new members as follows:


Alexis Agnew, Sharon Roffey, Val Roberts, Jo Saxelby-Balisky, Shiree Pickering and Marie Muller.

DISTRICT 31 DEMONSTRATES ZONTA POWER ON ROSE DAY

District 31 members participate in an advocacy walk to reinforce their commitment to ending violence against women.



District 31 member's demonstrated Zonta power in a Rose Day walk in Kaohsiung, Taiwan called "Walk Forward-Spread Love and Care", enforcing their commitment to the Zonta Says NO to Violence against Women campaign. Members urged the public to join the Zonta cause seeking gender equality through service and advocacy. District 31 Governor Hsin-hsin Yang also delivered the Zonta spirit of Conviction, Commitment and Courage to 320 people joining the 7 March walk and gave scholarships to 11 high school girls studying in the San Duo area in Kaohsiung.

Joining the "Walk Forward -Spread Love" event included Zontians from the district's 18 clubs, district Z club members, government officials and local residents. Yang also announced the district's plans to assist less fortunate women in San Duo, Taiwan in acquiring skills to become financially stronger and a project collaborating with local therapists to help women recover from the trauma. Almost 60 members from the four district Z clubs also participated in the Rose Day activity as volunteers.

Why is Economic Empowerment important?

Women are disproportionately affected by poverty (1) because of barriers to education and employment. Women also have less access to land and financial services. The economic empowerment of women is crucial in developing strong societies and strong economies.

Guaranteeing equal opportunities for women and men is not just the right thing to do. It's smart economics.

Consider the Facts

- Australian women working full time can expect to earn 17.4 per cent less than a male counterpart (2)
- Women do two thirds of the world's work, yet earn less than 10 per cent of the world's wages (3)
- Women tend to use their household funds to improve the welfare of their children, but often have no control over their income (4)
- The World Economic Forum's Gender Gap Report 2012 found that across 135 countries, greater gender equality improves its national competitiveness (5)
- Women in the Solomon Islands and Vanuatu comprise 85 per cent of vendors in fresh food markets, yet do not feel safe in the marketplace as women.(7)

UN Women's Approach

UN Women recognises that the economic empowerment of women is crucial to achieving true gender equality. The budgeting and earmarking of aid funding specifically for programs that will benefit women is a proven strategy, and one which UN Women campaigns for in countries around the world.(6)

UN Women supports women in reshaping conditions at both ends of the economic spectrum — from boosting women's participation in economic policy-making to supporting efforts to provide women with practical skills needed for securing sustainable livelihoods.
