Report of the Advocacy Committee Meeting 10th July 2020

Business

Child Marriage in Australia

The Committee discussed the response by Senators Marise Payne and Anne Ruston to our District 22 Board request that our Government develop a strategy to end Child Marriage in Australia. We are deeply disappointed that the response by the Senators totally failed to address our request. It was decided to make our disappointment noted and to request the District 22 Board consider responding to the reply from the Senators. A letter was drafted during this meeting.

16 Days of Activism campaign

Our focus this year will again be "Do Something" and Child Marriage.

Our campaign will be organised in the same way as 2019 with Orange Figures hosted by businesses and organisations and the banner put up at Centenary Lakes. We will also apply to the Council to have a second banner at Morayfield.

A letter to businesses will again be provided to members to explain our campaign and request that they consider hosting a figure.

Update re **Lady Musgrave booklet** for older women: Lorraine has had a discussion with Glynnis Gartside, one of the Coordinators of the distribution through Zonta clubs. The booklet we currently have is not the booklet that is to be distributed in August. An assurance has been given by the Lady Musgrave Trust that the upcoming publication will be appropriate for all of South East Queensland. As requested by the Lady Musgrave Trust, we have provided the names of five organisations from where this booklet could be distributed. As agreed at our Dinner Meeting we will now wait and confirm the suitability or otherwise of the booklet before sourcing more distribution outlets. When available booklets will be delivered to Lorraine's home.

Covid -19 needs

There was discussion around the severe financial impact of more women and their children due to the Covid - 19 pandemic. The Smith Family, which offers support for children living in poverty, has over 10,000 children needing sponsors. The sponsorship cost is \$52 per month and provides children with learning essentials such as books, data, uniforms. The Committee decided to seek confirmation that we would be able to specify gender and if so to put a proposal to the club to sponsor one or two children for the year.

The increased contact by women facing higher levels of domestic violence to support services during the Covid - 19 pandemic was recognised by the Committee. While the Moreton Shire Council public toilets have plaques advising contact advice for support, there is a need for more easily accessible help advice elsewhere. The Committee discussed the possibility of printing stickers that could potentially be affixed to doors and mirrors in op shops and female apparel businesses.

Members have noted information that, due to the Covid -19 impact on their circumstances, women are having issues obtaining sanitary items. The CEO at CADA will be contacted for advice on this reported need with a view to potential assistance from our club.

Nominations for Australian of the Year 2021

The desirability of our club being active within this award by nominating women, hopefully from our community but not necessarily so, was discussed. Currently women nominees make up only around 30% of nominations. Nominations for 2021 close on the 31st July 2020. The Committee decided to find out if Debbie Kilroy [Sisters Inside and campaigner Human Rights for women in the Justice system] has been nominated and if not, to prepare to nominate her.

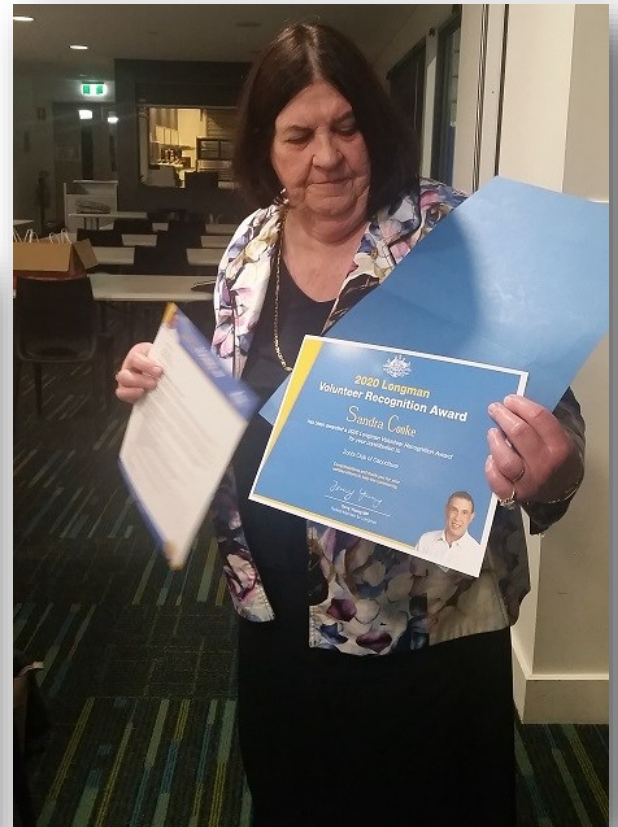
