Phoebe Rose Inc - Charity Objectives

Phoebe Rose Inc is a tax concessional charity, the objectives of this charity is "to support families with children who have disabilities within the community and to provide relief by purchasing and providing specialised resources by way of fundraising events and donations from organizations.

Phoebe's Condition.

At 11 months Phoebe was diagnosed with a condition called Agenesis of the Corpus Callosum. This is where the front part of Phoebe's brain did not develop to its full capacity therefore not allowing messages to be sent back and forth from the left to the right side of her brain. Phoebe's body and all its functions are what is known as Global Developmental delay. To put it in its simplest terms, Phoebe is 7 and still unable to walk, talk, eat via her mouth and many other little things that are so simple to most of us. Initial Project – Specialist bedroom and bathroom for Phoebe.

The Stewart's family 2-storey home was built by the talented Bradley Stewart 8 years ago so unfortunately it is not really functional for a disabled child but they had no idea that life was going to be as it is. The bedrooms as most are in a 2-storey home are on the second level, which at the moment requires Bradley and Rachel to carry Phoebe upstairs for bathing, bed etc. Phoebe at the present weighs 22kg and as years go on her weight increases, which creates a huge amount of stress on their bodies and not to mention the risk of them falling. The plans as a family are now to extend a section of their downstairs area to create a safe space for Phoebe and the family to carry out her daily routines without the ongoing stress to their bodies and family. The estimated cost of the new bedroom and bathroom is \$60,000.00
