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President's Message

Dear members.

As our Zonta year draws to a close we are finishing on an extraordinarily high note with the start of our self-protection programme on Friday 29th April, at Pine Rivers High School.

You may remember this programme came about because in early 2010 we were debating whether to support CEO Challenge Programme by paying for awareness sessions in two Pine Rivers workplaces, and we decided that we would rather put our funds towards a programme that would have the Zonta Club of Pine Rivers' name on it, reach out to younger people, and be aimed at the prevention of, and protection from, violence.

Karen told us about the Erin Cash's self defense course for girls, and after Erin attended the August dinner meeting it was decided that Suzanne and Dot would write to the High Schools in Pine Rivers inviting them to take up our offer to fund a self-protection programme for Grade 9's developed by Erin.

This offer was accepted by Pine Rivers High School and Karen and I were there to watch the first sessions unfold. Karen took photos of Erin in action and stayed for both sessions, while I left after the first session full of admiration for Erin after watching her extremely physical first session with a load of rowdy 14 & 15 year old boys. (I needed Karen to point out there was only 20 of them – I thought there was least!)

Our Club is so lucky to have Erin as our facilitator for this programme, as members who saw Erin's run-through of her two programmes (one for girls and one for boys) at the April dinner meeting will realise. But what we didn't see then was her high rate of physical fitness. She had those rowdy boys jumping knees to chest, doing boxing moves and multiple push ups and she was doing the same moves with them every step of the way. And then without pause for breath she would go back to the programme getting them to think and talk about good role models. how to defuse aggressive behaviour, age of sexual consent, people they could turn to when they are in, or witness, bad situations, and some basic defence strategies and moves.

It was great to see Erin in action, and any member who can make the time to come to

one of the sessions will be richly rewarded to see that our funds are being used to such good effect by a woman as professional, well organised and dedicated as Erin is.

I will be going to a couple of the sessions which Erin has tailored for the girls, and I am pleased to say that Sara from the Caboolture Club has taken up our offer to observe one of these sessions also.

Meantime, our May meeting is of course both our dinner meeting and our AGM and change-over meeting and I look forward to seeing you all then.
