








AMELIA EARHART FELLOWSHIP Amelia Earhart Day 11th January 2012



"The Amelia Earhart Fellowship is more than a fellowship that helped me financially while conducting my research. I met so many wonderful women in all walks of life that are truly engaged in helping women to advance and succeed, the spirit of which I will appreciate for a long time to come."

Today, women remain a distinct minority in science and engineering, representing approximately 10 percent of professionals in these fields. The Amelia Earhart Fellowship program helps talented women, pursuing advanced studies in the typically male-dominated fields of aerospace-related sciences and engineering, achieve their educational goals. The Fellowship enables these women to invest in state-of-the-art computers to conduct their research, purchase expensive books and resource materials, and participate in specialized studies around the globe. Amelia Earhart Fellows have gone on to become astronauts, aerospace engineers, astronomers, professors, geologists, business owners, heads of companies, even Secretary of the US Air Force.

Since the program's inception, Zonta has awarded 1,333 Amelia Earhart Fellowships, totaling US\$7.5 million, to women from 65 countries.

Ho Ho Ho or No No No?

For those of you who shop on line Some tips from 2 Security Services

Ensure that the site is secure. Before entering any financial or personal details, ensure that the site's URL in the address bar starts with "https://" as illustrated below.



Depending on your browser, you can also look for the presence of a closed padlock and green background to let you know that the site uses SSL (Secure Sockets Layer) encryption to scramble the data before it is sent out over the internet. It is important to note that SSL only ensures that the data are being encrypted before travelling across the web. It does not guarantee that the recipient will use the sent data with your best interests in mind.

Don't be scared to use your credit card. Contrary to commonly held belief, credit cards stack up well against other forms of online payment, such as direct bank-to-bank transfers and debit cards. Credit cards tend to offer greater protection than debit cards as they don't involve direct transfers from your own bank account. Financial institutions also protect their credit lines fanatically, and it is usually far easier to dispute and reverse fraudulent activity on your credit account than it is on your normal bank account. We find that the consumers who subscribe to the "no credit cards online" stigma are usually those who ignore all the other rules in this blog.

Go the extra yard with Credit Card Authentication services. If you do choose to use a credit card for your online purchases, you should strongly consider using the additional authentication services of Verified by Visa or Mastercard SecureCode. Referred to as '3D Secure', these services have been developed to facilitate a secure online connection between cardholders and their card issuer at the time of purchase. These services are designed to improve consumer trust and confidence in purchasing goods online and are well worth using.

Be Careful of Mobile Web Shopping and Apps: According to a <u>survey</u> conducted last month by the National Retail Federation (NRF), 52.6% of users who own a smartphone said they will use their device to perform some shopping related activities such as research products, redeem coupons, and use mobile applications to assist in their shopping endeavors. On the other hand, McAfee cites a 76% increase in malware targeting Android™ devices, making it the most targeted smartphone platform.

There have been several instances reported by <u>McAfee</u> of new <u>malware</u> that targets Quick Response (QR) codes and digital barcodes. When you scan the QR codes with your smartphone's camera, it directs you to websites which have malicious applications that they recommend you download. Once your device is infected, it can cause severe harm to your stored data and put your personal information at risk. To safeguard yourself from such threats, always take these safety measures:

Make sure your mobile device is protected with an antivirus application.

Only scan QR codes from reputable sources.

Only install applications from reputable sources. For example, if you have an Android device, only install applications from the Android Market. Also, make sure you read users' reviews of the apps you are planning on installing on your device.
