

The Burdekin Theatre and the Burdekin ZONTA Club have signed a partnership which will assist fundraising by the women's charity. The partnership was agreed yesterday between Dr Margaret Culpan, President of the Burdekin ZONTA Club and Malcolm Calder, Manager of the Burdekin Cultural Complex. In a joint statement, the partnership was outlined as a wonderful example of community cooperation that holds potential benefits for both organisations. "Our current project involves the purchase of birthing kits to assist young mothers. That is all about the future of our children and it is something we are very committed to," said Dr Culpan. "We are aiming for making 1,000 of these kits available to young mothers, and see this partnership as making a significant contribution towards ZONTA realising its goals. Mr Calder says that, while the theatre is very much a commercial business, it is also important to sustain positive relationships with diverse individuals and organisations in the Burdekin.



"ZONTA does some very impressive work", said Mr Calder, "and through this partnership, part of the price of each ticket to our forthcoming production of our 'Calendar Girls' on March 16th will be donated to ZONTA".

International Women's Day (IWD) is celebrated on March 8th across the world. It is an occasion for looking back on past struggles and accomplishments, and more importantly, for looking ahead to the untapped potential and opportunities that await future generations of women.

Foundation and Development

In 1910, Clara Zetkin, the leader of the Women's Office for the Social Democratic Party in Germany tabled the idea of an International Women's Day at the second International Conference of Working Women in Copenhagen. The proposal received unanimous assent from over one hundred women representing seventeen countries.

IWD Today

Since those early years, International Women's Day has become a time to reflect on progress made, to call for change and to celebrate acts of courage and determination by ordinary women who have played an extraordinary role in the history of their countries and communities.

The UN General Assembly adopted a resolution inviting Member States to observe International Women's Day in accordance with their historical and national traditions. The purpose of this day is to recognize that in order to secure peace and social progress women must be equal participants in public life and enjoy the same rights and freedoms as men. For the women of the world, the symbolism of International Women's Day has a wider meaning. It is an occasion to review how far women have come in their struggle for equality, peace and development. It is also an opportunity to unite, network and mobilise for meaningful change.

Greek Female Painters

"Inspiration for change" is this year's theme designated by the United Nations.

In Melbourne this year, the Food for Thought Network in collaboration with the Greek Museum are organising a painting exhibition titled "Transformation" and for the 1st time is expected to present seven Greek-Australian female painters in honor of International Women's Day.

"The seven female painters participating come from different generations and regions. They draw their inspiration from their inner world, their families' personal world, from religion, mythology and their role as mothers, wives, daughters and guardians of culture," stated the art historian Elizabeth Gertsakis.

The seven women were selected because they use different techniques and materials such as oil, acrylic, egg tempera, gold leaf, threads, wax, pyrography and modern technology and screen printing as well. The exhibition will be launched on Sunday, March 9 at the Greek Museum of Melbourne.

As an active community leader and South Sea Islander Elder, Joyce has always demonstrated superior commitment and dedication to attending a wide range of community events.

Throughout her life, she has dedicated herself to her family and to helping and empowering people in the Burdekin community. She raised 5 children and worked as a Community Education Counsellor at the Ayr State High School. She has been involved with Burdekin Area Youth Watch (Baywatch) for a number of years. Baywatch was formed for local children who were disengaged from school. They provide a wide range of activities for the children and Joyce is always present as a mentor and South Sea Islander Elder at community events. She was a member of the Baywatch Committee for the recent 150 year celebrations. This saw her cutting the celebration cake during an event at Baywatch and also hosting a tour of the Burdekin with children to educate them on South Sea Islander history.

Joyce strives for cultural excellence within the community by working to bring people from different backgrounds together for the benefit of individuals and the overall good of the community. This includes South Sea Islander, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and people from a culturally and linguistically diverse background.

Joyce has been helping to bring the community together and make life better for people throughout her lifetime, which now spans more than 80 years. She is an excellent role model for community members of all ages and backgrounds and has achieved a great many things whilst, at times, admirably enduring personal hardship and suffering.

Other nominees were Jenny Powell who has been an advocate for cancer in all aspects for so many years, Merle Scott for her tireless work as a volunteer and educator with the local radio station especially during cyclones, Pat Nuttall director and primary driver behind the Burdekin Singers and who has produced many young people to star quality, and Pat Strathdee for her 50 years dedication to the Endeavour Foundation with service to parents, families and carers of people with a disability.

These women were all deserved nominees for the amazing voluntary work they do in our district.


Whitworth.
