DISTRICT 22 HISTORY

The first Zonta Club in Australia was established in 1929 in Sydney and included Australian poet, Dorothea Mackellar, among its members.

While the Club disbanded in 1935, a Canadian Zontian, Dorothy Thompson, reintroduced Zonta International in Australia and New Zealand in 1965 with the organisation of 12 Clubs, one in each Australian capital city and five in New Zealand. These Clubs became District 16 of Zonta International.

By 1990, the number of clubs in District 16 had grown to the extent that, at the Zonta International Convention in Dallas in 1990, District 16 was divided into 3 separate Districts: District 16 (New Zealand), District 23 (Victoria, Tasmania, Western Australia, South Australia, and the Northern Territory), and District 24 (Queensland, New South Wales, and the Australian Capital Territory).

Further growth in Clubs and membership led to a decision at the 2008 Zonta International Convention to divide District 24 into two Districts: District 22 (Queensland and the Northern Rivers of New South Wales) and District 24 (the remainder of New South Wales and the Australian Capital Territory).

District 22 has 47 Clubs from Cairns in the North and Mount Isa and Longreach in the west to Lismore in the Northern Rivers of New South Wales.

The District has more than 1100 active and engaged members including two former International Presidents of Zonta International: Leneen Forde AC who served for the 1990-1992 biennium; and Mary Magee OAM who served for the 2000-2002 biennium.

District Conference

District Conference is the time each two years that we come together to determine the future of our District and elect our District leaders for the next biennium as well as renew friendships from previous Conferences and Area Meetings and make new friends from other Clubs.

The 2013 District Conference will be held from 27-29 September 2013 at the Noosa Convention and Exhibition Centre, 3 Hilton Terrace, Tewantin, 4565. DG Judith Anderson OAM and her Conference Chairman are working on a very interesting and innovative details of which will be available very soon.

MEMBERSHIP MANUAL

MARIAN DE FOREST MEMBERSHIP AND CLASSIFICATION MANUAL AND ORGANIZATION AND EXTENSION MANUAL

Zonta is a membership organization. People join because they believe in Zonta's ideals and want to contribute their time and talents to fulfil these.

A vibrant growing membership is critical to securing Zonta's ideals. Zonta members come from many walks of life and live in all parts of the world. To assist clubs to grow their membership, this manual has been developed. It relates to both existing clubs and clubs that are being established. In addition to this manual, there is considerable material available to members on Zonta's website at www.zonta.org and within the membership. Membership material is continually being updated and members are encouraged to visit the site regularly. If there are queries which cannot be answered by the club membership committee in the first instance, they can be referred to the District Organization, Membership and Classification Committee for further clarification. This manual is in three parts: the first section is general, the second relates to growing membership and the third provides the requirements for starting new clubs. This manual replaces, and includes the appropriate content from, the Organisation and Extension Manual and the Marian de Forest Membership and Classification Manual. With your support and commitment, Zonta will continue to be an organization that is relevant and attracts and retains members committed to realising Zonta's mission of advancing the status of women worldwide through service and advocacy.
