Dr Helen Row was a charter member of the Club and a pioneer in the field of child psychiatry in Queensland. Following her retirement. Helen committed herself to Zonta and was instrumental in establishing a dozen or so Queensland Zonta clubs from Cairns to Coolangatta. The established a memorial fund in 1992 in conjunction with The University of Queensland to commemorate Helen's life of achievement. The prize is awarded for research or related work that promotes the prevention or treatment of mental health problems, including psychiatric and behavioural problems, in childhood adolescence.




ZONTA ROSE DAY
