PURSUIT OF EXCELLENCE IN ZONTA COMMUNITY SERVICE

Zonta International has established a new award that is a terrific opportunity to showcase district and club service projects. The Zonta Service Recognition Award has been established to recognise outstanding service projects undertaken by Zonta clubs and districts which benefit women in the local community. There are two categories of projects to be considered for the award:

- (a) Service projects that improve the status of women and girls in general (improve their legal, political, economic, educational, health and professional status), and
- (b) Service projects to prevent and fight violence against women and girls.

This all leads up to Convention in Orlando in 2014. Six of the most outstanding service projects sponsored by clubs, and up to three sponsored by districts, will receive the Zonta Service Recognition Award during Convention.



Projects nominated under category (b), even if not selected for a service award, may be posted on the ZI website in the section dedicated to the *Zonta Says NO* campaign. Posting of club service/advocacy projects against violence to women and girls on the ZI site is part of the current phase of the *Zonta Says NO* campaign, culminating in worldwide common action in November this year with Orange Ribbon Day on November 25 and sixteen Days of Activism.

REMEMBERING HELEN ROW

At the April dinner, the Club awarded the Helen Row Memorial Prize for 2013 to Hannah Thomas. Hannah is a PhD candidate at the University of Queensland. Hannah was awarded the prize for her work in better understanding non-suicidal, self-harming behaviours in adolescents.



The prize commemorates Dr Helen Row, a former Club member, who was a respected pioneer in the field of child psychiatry in Queensland. After Helen retired, she committed herself to Zonta by organising new clubs. From 1977 until her death in December 1987, Helen was instrumental in the formation of many new Queensland clubs.

The memorial fund was established in 1992 by the Zonta Club of Brisbane in conjunction with the University of Queensland. From the beginning until this year, Rhyl Row has managed the program and the Club is indebted to Rhyl for her service and passionate promotion of Helen’s legacy and the Club’s memorial prize.

Newer members may notice Helen’s and Rhyl’s surname, and wonder at the relationship. Rhyl has kindly provided these personal memories of Dr Row:

“Helen Row became my Mother in Law in July 1968. Quite a daunting experience, as I remember she was so different from my mother who was a little girl from the ‘bush’. However I learnt to ‘handle’ this very dominant woman quite quickly and became very fond of her and admired her greatly despite hearing so frequently of her disagreements with various Zonta members!

When she retired she needed other interests and one day asked us what we thought of her joining a Club called Zonta. Of course we had never heard of it but thought it a very good idea. She was a “charter” member and soon became very involved. Of course she is remembered for creating eleven new clubs in Queensland. My memories of this were her stubbornness in careering around the countryside in buses opposed to flying... this was to save money for Zonta. Our concern was that she had a leg impediment as a result of Polio when she was young. Many of her family members said to me that she was very self conscious of this which accounted for her brusque manner. She died on Christmas Eve 1987 and at her Funeral many Zonta members said this date was in her plan!

My “boys” and I have so many very happy memories of her and respected her greatly. This was also shown by the very many Zontans who so willingly donated to what was to become ‘The Helen Row-Zonta International Memorial Prize’ to her memory.

I felt greatly honoured to administer this prize for so many years and I do hope this can continue for at least the next twenty.”

WOW PROJECT IN CAMBODIA

At the April dinner, Reuben Heim gave a very interesting and touching report on his recent experiences in Cambodia, especially about the Woman of Worth (WOW) project which assists women to establish small enterprises. It is very encouraging to see the commitment to service and passion for advocacy demonstrated by Reuben. While the Club supports international projects through the Zonta International Foundation, members may be interested in supporting the WOW project as individuals or through bringing it to the attention of friends, colleagues or other organisations with which they are associated. JANE M. KLAUSMAN WOMEN IN BUSINESS SCHOLARSHIP

We are undertaking a targeted search for a 2013 Club Jjane M. Klausman (JMK) Women in Business scholarship recipient. Do you know someone who would be a worthy recipient? The scholarship is open to women studying in a business-related field, of any age from any background, from undergraduate through to masters level. Successful applicants in the past have demonstrated high academic achievement and strong commitment to social service.

The scholarship operates at Zonta Club, District and International levels. Applications are made to Clubs, which decide a nomination to be considered at district, and subsequently successful district winners are eligible for twelve international prizes of US\$7,000. Zonta International also awards US\$1,000 to every district winner. The Zonta Club of Brisbane also offers \$1,000 for the Club's successful applicants.

The closing date for applications to be received by the Club is 17 May 2013.
