Lea says that this year's line up has just arrived. This year's reds include a Massena Barossa Barbera 2011. Our wine merchant, Phil Manser says of it "Barbera is a variety grown in northern Italy and is a crazy looking red that is pinot noir meets Grenache meets merlot in flavor... The recommended retail price on this wine is \$27.... breathing is highly recommended". Can't wait!

GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIPS FOR WOMEN

Applications are now open for the next round of the Queensland Government's Supporting Women Scholarships program. The program is designed to help women of all ages and backgrounds to gain qualifications in fields that have been traditionally male-dominated and are considered priority and skills shortage areas. The scholarships are for vocational education and training and university study (Certificate IV through to postgraduate qualifications) in the fields of agriculture and environment, architecture and building, earth science, engineering and information technology.

The scholarships are valued at up to \$5,000 each year (up to a maximum of \$20,000.
