About 12 months ago, Jo Diessel, President of Brisbane East, invited other Brisbane Zonta Clubs to a meeting to discuss the idea of a combined ZSN project for Brisbane. Clubs conduct various activities during the 16 days of activism and for the ZSN campaign and their capacities to participate and contribute varies also. I took away from the meeting the idea that "bigger must be better". So, with the support of our Distract 22 Governor, Area Directors, Club Presidents, Advocacy Chairs, and others, a group was formed to plan a combined ZSN project for 2017 to raise awareness of violence against women and girls and to promote its prevention. We are now in the midst of the 16 days of activism for 2017 and the promotion of ZSN supported by this combined project is fantastic. If you travelled inbound over the Story Bridge you would have seen the monster Zonta banner. If you travelled on the inner-city ferries, you would have spotted orange ladies and ZSN posters. You might also have spotted oranges ladies, children and pets about town at ferry terminals, in businesses and government buildings, and at shopping centres. In addition to cut-out pets with orange ladies, Vicki Lomax, our Advocacy Chair, introduced a new promotion on the impact of DV on pets with pop-up pets from the RSPCA. There have been walks, runs, breakfasts, meetings, media publicity, and endless other activities. The Group will soon meet to review 2017 and to plan for 2018 to keep up the momentum. We painted Brisbane Orange, now we need to further increase the number of community members who understand why "Orange" and continue to encourage changes in community attitudes and behaviours. What great Zontians Jo Diessel and Ros Kinder are! They tirelessly coordinated the combined ZSN project meetings and made ideas happen. A big thank you to Vicki for leading our Club's involvement and also to the many members who participated. I have included some photos toward the end of the newsletter in case you missed the spectacle.

The end of year is near. This is traditionally a time when many of us are preparing for festivities, family gatherings, and holidays or maybe just relaxing. We have a couple of remaining service tasks to undertake before the end of 2017 for those not as fortunate as most of us. We will again provide Christmas packs

from your donations and a collection of handbags for women currently resident at the Chisholm Refuge. A group will also help pack hampers for Micah to deliver to the disadvantaged in Brisbane, including men, women and children, who become disadvantaged because of domestic and family violence. In fund raising, we have another sausage sizzle and we must get moving on plans for the movie afternoon in March. Before we know it in the new year it will be time for new activity, award presentations, strategic planning, and the beginning of the new Zonta biennium.

Anyone not at the November meeting can still bring goods and \$5 contribution towards Pamper packs for Chisholm (see below).




Pamper Packs for Chisholm Refuge


