ADVOCACY

ADVOCACY COMMITTEE MEETING REPORT AT 9.30AM ON THURSDAY 16 MARCH 2017 AT 32 LYNFIELD DRIVE, CABOOLTURE

Present: Waltraud Clark, Cecil Nielson, Carolyne Spiers and Sandra Cooke.

Sandra Cooke chaired the meeting and welcomed Carolyne to the Advocacy Committee.

Zonta International Advocacy Project Scorecard (September 2016): This latest version has been separated from Service and has two additional short paragraphs or sentences related to Zonta International's stance regarding violence towards women and girls. This Score Card will be useful to the Advocacy Committee when considering future projects.

Design of Orange Ladies, Girl and Boy Finalised: Thanks to Waltraud's thorough preparation all designs were finalised and are Caboolture-specific.

The following need to be considered when Waltraud liaises with the members of the Burpengary Men's Shed in order to finalise construction details:

- The heights of the figures will need to conform to the size of the plywood sheets. It was suggested that the lady be 110 cm tall, the girl, 80 cm tall and the boy 70 cm tall. The final heights will be taller due to the stable bases into which each figure's extended foot length will be inserted. It was suggested that the boy could wear an orange "Zonta Says No to Domestic Violence" cap folded to fit upon his head.
- It was suggested that the offcuts be made into left and right female adult feet and also painted orange to be used to indicate the number of women killed as a result of domestic violence in Queensland/Australia annually probably based on one calendar year which is how they are usually published.
- The Committee would like an orange stand with a small rectangular board at the top and two or three hooks near the top of the board in order to display black, wooden numerals with space underneath to attach a label stating "The number of women in Queensland or Australia who died last year as a result of domestic violence". (The Committee will research where this data can be readily obtained, however a quick check on Google revealed that in 2016 72 Australian women died and in 2017 to 16 March 2017 nine women have died).



 The minimum number required is 16 orange ladies, one girl and one boy, however the Burpengary Men's Shed members asked how many were required so Waltraud will also negotiate any extra beyond the minimum.

Waltraud and other members of the Advocacy Committee members will answer any member's questions re the above and further developments since this meeting at the 29 March Dinner Meeting.

Display of Orange Ladies During 16 Days of Activism, 25

November 2017 to 10 December 2017: Sandra will contact the Zonta Club of Brisbane East for ideas for us to use re the letter that they send to local businesses regarding displaying an orange lady for part or the whole of the 16 days, the roster for Club members to deliver and collect the orange lady to the host business /businesses during the 16 days and the letter of appreciation attached to a certificate to these businesses.

Launch of 2017 16 Days of Activism: The following ideas are a result of brief discussion. Club members will be asked for their ideas or suggestions. The Committee will follow these up:

- Launch venue
- Launch time of day (breakfast, morning, afternoon, evening)
- Involvement of Moreton Bay Regional Council Councillors
- Launch Guest Speaker
- Invitation Flyer
- Invited guests (Burpengary Men's Shed members also to be invited to 2018 Volunteer's Morning Tea, etc)
- Newspaper, Facebook, Radio publicity
- Extending Library Display in Caboolture to other local libraries (Bribie Island, Woodford) but not into Moreton Bay Regional Council areas covered by other Zonta Clubs such as Redcliffe and Pine Rivers



MEMBERSHIP

Membership Report March 2017

Membership Committee (Sandra and Cecil) met Monday 13 March at Sandra's home, Wamuran, 1.30pm.

1.Potential Member and Guests: Patricia has completed a prospective Member's Form for Christine Blatchford. Membership would like to meet with Christine. Cecil will follow up with Christine re a meeting with her, to also include Patricia, her sponsor. Cecil will also contact Marilyn Ebson and Lyn Howells re attendance at the March Dinner Meeting.

2. Area Meeting Outcomes: Sandra and Cecil presented Lt Governor Sandy (also District Chair of membership) with our Membership Booklet for new members. Sandy was impressed with our resource. Cecil gave a summary of Sandy's session on Membership (see attached) and Sandra summarised the session with Lyn. The ZI small booklet for new members, 'Welcome to Zonta', was discussed and Cecil gave Sandra some copies to include within our own new member's resource booklet. Judith Anderson had mentioned a Certificate for New Members which was on the ZI website. A question was asked during the meeting about the use of the word, 'professional'. The answer was that it remains as it is in the Manual. However, the word 'professional' only appears once. Elsewhere the reference is 'women'. Sandra will also follow up with a query to other Caboolture Zonta members who attended Lyn's session about some concerns regarding contacting former awardees.



- **3. Locating Resources on ZI Website:** Sandra looked up the ZI website and located this Certificate which can be given to new members. We discovered that the classification lists are now called Occupations Alphabetical, and Occupations Numerical. Sandra will email to Cecil copies of these resources, found under the heading Tools on the ZI Website. We noted the difficulties encountered in logging in to the website.
- **4. Former Awardees:** Sandra was able to find the names of former YWPA awardees for 96-97, 98-99, 99-2000, and 2006.

Action after Meeting

Cecil and Patricia (sponsor) met with Christine on Thursday 23 March at The Coffee Club (near the
Caboolture Hospital). The Membership Committee has now started the process for membership of ZI, and a
recommendation will go to the next Board Meeting. At the Breast Cushion Stuffing Day on Saturday 25
March, Christine Macaulay expressed interest in Zonta, and Sandra has contacted Christine, inviting her to

our Club Dinner Meeting 29 March. Cecil has followed up with reminders to Marilyn Ebson and Lyn Howells re the Club Dinner meeting.

- President Glenda referred members to the section

MEMBERSHIP MATTERS

Workshop – Sandy Venn-brown, Lt Governor & District Chair of Membership

Focus: Retention

A. Three Questions

- 1. Why did you join Zonta?
- 2. Why do you stay?
- 3. Are the answers the same for both questions?

Group participants were asked to answer the questions in pairs, then invited to share their answers.

Main outcomes, emphasised by Sandy were: We all have different reasons for joining; we all have different reasons for staying. The answers to Q1 and Q2 are not necessarily the same.

B. Retention

Answers to Q2 are relevant to retention. There are different reasons for staying but clubs should be mindful of activities that will encourage members to stay.

C. Resignations

Brainstorming followed with ideas suggested from group.

Some discussion on *natural attrition* – members re-locating to another area, home and family reasons, sickness etc. A good idea would be to maintain friendship and contact with ex-Zontians, who leave regretfully but generally happy with club.

There are also *problem resignations*. Group brainstormed ideas. Sometimes members do not know it could be a problem resignation. President could conduct an Exit Interview for such resignations. (*Cecil's Note: Membership Committee has a role here.*)

D. Resolutions

Again, Sandy brainstormed ideas from group. Some ideas were:

- Question about corporate membership
- If the reason for resigning is finances, there are ways and means to help members
- Knowing why Exit Interviews
- All members voting on projects
- Having Membership Survey

Workshop had to finish as time was short.



GUEST SPEAKER

In 2012 Social Worker and Disability Support Worker Adam James founded Cup from Above. In his words he "sells coffee and gives away miracles". The café, located in Aspley, functions as a drop-in centre for people in crisis where they come to meet with Café Chaplains who assist them. Every day they feed those in poverty, support women escaping DV and help the addicted into recovery. The café is a profitable business that makes

a small surplus for charity, but is also used for training unemployed people with significant barriers to employment. Many of Adam's customers are complex individuals trying to integrate back into the community. They develop the skills and confidence necessary to find an independent sustainable career. Cup from Above's coffee is famous and was recently voted 7th best in Australia.
