President's Note:

Dear Members

At the time of writing this at 6pm, the police will have dealt with 530 domestic violence matters today in Australia. Police currently deal with an average of 5,000 domestic violence matters every week. That's one every two minutes! How do I know this? On the ABC news website, my attention was drawn to a woman, Kirrily Dear, who plans to run 1,300Km from Broken Hill to Sydney in 19 days to raise awareness of domestic violence. On the side of the news article was a monitor of national police responses involving DV. Kirrily says that the experience of long distance running and DV are different though she believes the endurance required in long-distance running can be a reminder of the challenges faced by victims of DV. Kirrily wants to particularly focus attention on the impact of DV on children and plans to visit schools and hold events along the way. Increasingly of late we are presented with news reports of children killed or deeply physically and emotionally scarred by being caught up in domestic and family violence. I hope Kirrily has a safe run and DV receives the attention it deserves. At our dinner meeting Vicki shared with us the less well-publicised consequences for pets that also can be innocent victims in these circumstances. Our fellow Zontians at Brisbane East have pets accompanying their orange ladies, maybe we should have one also. Her idea of pop-up pets at our shopping centre displays during the 16 days of activism is well worth support. None of us are likely to be able to respond as Kirrily will, though we can make our contribution as Zontians.

Our last dinner meeting was something of a marathon effort and we had a showcase of outstanding young women. It was a delight to induct a new member, Elizabeth. Elizabeth is going to have the opportunity to share a "get to know me" talk at the next dinner meeting and will also give us some insight into her career, where the education sector is going, and managing a young family and career today. We had the pleasure of presenting the JMK award to Siobhan O'Sullivan who has just an amazing history of achievements for someone at such as young age. We wish her well in her JMK nominations at higher Zonta levels and in her future endeavours. To round off, we had the pleasure of listening to Dr Hannah Krause AO, a local urogynaecologist, relate stories of her remarkable contributions to medicine and to women's health in the developing world. While we can read testimonials and watch videos, interreacting with someone who has been in the field brings a new reality to these issues, some of which we contribute to through the ZIF. Hannah was an inspiration.

Thank you to everyone who came along or otherwise contributed to our Blue Illusion fashion workshop. It was a fun event and Chieko and Siti took up modelling with great panache. I wholeheartedly thank Louella and staff at Blue Illusion who invited us back, are so generous, and such fun to work with. We now have to get some more fundraising action on the way.
