

CLUB NOMINATING COMMITTEE AND CLUB ELECTIONS (from the Zonta Club Manual—2014).

THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE

All clubs are required to have a nominating committee. The nominating committee seeks suitably qualified candidates for elected positions.

The nominating committee consists of at least three members who are knowledgeable about the Zonta club, its members and the qualifications required for each club office position. They need to identify potential nominees and make nominations according to the qualifications that will best suit each office.

Election of Members of the Nomination Committee

- 1. Election of members to the nominating committee may take place at the election meeting, allowing the nominating committee a full year to identify future office bearers.
- 2. The club board fills vacancies on the nominating committee.
- 3. The president is not an ex-officio member of this committee.
- 4. A club officer or director generally should not also be a member of this committee.

Duties

- 1. Encourage club members to nominate candidates for the vacant positions (see suggested form for nomination in Club Manual—Part 3-Forms).
- 2. Contact prospective nominees, inform them of the duties of office and obtain their consent for nomination.
- 3. Nominate one or more consenting, qualified members for each elective position to be filled at the annual election.
- 4. At club level, members of the nominating committee may be nominated for office. They should leave the room during consideration of their nomination but return to vote.
- 5. Nominate at least three members for the next term's nominating committee.
- 6. Report the slate of officers, directors and, if desired, the candidates for the nominating committee, before the election meeting.
- 7. Maintain confidentiality of discussion of prospective nominees.

I am involved in a number of community advisory and sporting committees and I am the secretary of the Rockhampton Branch of Community Supporting Police Inc.

I joined the Queensland Police Service at 18 and have served across many regional areas as well as Brisbane and in many functions in policing. I am presently the Patrol Group Inspector in Rockhampton in charge of 151 sworn officers and my area encompasses Yeppoon, Emu Park, Rockhampton and Gracemere.

I moved to Rockhampton in mid 2008 upon being appointed to commissioned rank in the Queensland Police Service.

Liberia Fistula Project resumes full operations.

Zonta International Jan 27, 2015

Following a significant reduction in the incidence of Ebola in Liberia, the Liberia Fistula Project, a partnership between UNFPA and Zonta International, resumed full scale operations in December and has already carried out the following activities:


a) A revolving fund loan scheme,
 a pilot project in Owensgrove
 District, has greatly increased
 health facility delivery from 5%



- of the clinic's area population to 25% despite the Ebola epidemic. Nineteen (19) pregnant women benefited with 18 of the beneficiaries delivering safely in the health facility and now doing well in their various communities. Because of this initiative, the Grand Bassa County health team and the community commend the Liberia Fistula Project for the loan scheme and recommend that this initiative be rolled out in other strengths to strengthen maternal and newborn health.
- b) Procured and distributed essential drugs and medical supplies for maternal health services for use in two facilities in Owensgrove District, Grand Bassa County.
- Trained 20 fistula survivors in advocacy, communication and counseling skills to serve as advocates for fistula prevention sensitization and identification of new cases during and after the Ebola epidemic.
 These advocates reach out to their communities to help prevent fistula, thereby saving other women and girls from suffering the same fate.
- d) A community outreach and sensitization campaign reached more than 10,000 community members in Grand Bassa, Margibi and Montserrado Counties via advocacy meetings with community leaders, volunteers, video club owners, etc. and sensitization for fistula prevention and identification of new cases.
- e) Two fistula patients were recruited, screened and surgically managed at the Ganta Outreach in Nimba County. The two patients were completely dry after surgery.

For the beginning of this programme year, the project has started planning and implementation of its regular activities.

Zonta maintains a presence in countries marked in Gold.
