United Nations Day Guest

At the October Dinner Meeting traditionally we acknowledge and celebrate Zonta's ties with United Nations. The month of October is chosen because United Nations Day is held on October 24.

This year our dinner speaker will be Frances Orford, a teacher from Bunya, who was a recipient of the Order of Australia this year for her work in assisting young refugees to integrate into the local community.

Mrs Orford teaches at Yeronga State High School where refugee students from African and Middle Eastern countries make up about 50% of the school population. Her role involves more than just providing English lessons to migrants. She helps the students integrate into the local community through social networking, community groups, support and advice, even helps them to find employment and has attended birthing classes with some of the young women.

Although Mrs Orford has a busy time coming up in October, with a family wedding that brings her 98 year old mother visiting from England, she is keen to speak to the Zonta Club of Pine Rivers. She believes In furthering the communities knowledge of the courage with which these young refugees approach life in their new country and an appreciation of the diversity that they bring to our city.

Where do our fees go?

Before I joined Zonta, I asked the question about whether Zonta is just an organization that supports a whole lot of executives to fly around the world. I was assured that was not the case. Well, in a way we do. Our membership fees cover many items and I thought that members would like to know what happens to our membership fees.

Our club members at this point in time pay \$175.00 per year.

US\$65.00 is sent to Zonta International. This is increasing to US\$80.00 next year.

\$A30.00 goes to district fees and the rest into our admin account.

Why, you might ask, do we have to pay all this to international and district. Well the answer is simple. As I have just completed 2 years as area director, I could not have done it without the district budget to cover all out of pocket expenses. E.g. travel to all clubs. These costs and

costs of the other district board members come out of the district fees.

All area meetings, district conferences and international conferences have to be self funded which means the costs of attending have to cover the costs of the functions.

Our club is very supportive of our members and pays for the President's or club delegate's registration fees to area, district and international conferences. We pay one third of the air travel of the delegate to international. Over the last few years, we have also paid for any interested members to attend the area meetings. We have a healthy admin account and try to give back to the members when we can. Before email, clubs had printing or postage and photcopying of newsletters and costs of other any correspondence.

Last night, I represented our club at the NCWQ AGM which was as always, very informative and interesting. The guest speakers were some recipients of their bursaries:

(National Council of Women Qld)

- Marney O'Dea year 12 student from Kenmore high who talked on volunteering as a cub master and the joy of supporting younger people learn more about the world.
- Keryn MacDonald talked about guiding and how the Guides are celebrating their 100 year
 anniversary. She had a power point presentation on how to make the difference by educating
 one girl in a remote village. I have seen and read this before but not sure where or when and it
 is most interesting. It goes like this help one girl- she buys a cow goes into business- she
 helps others- etc etc. Very good.
- Ms Sintayehu Mekonnen was winner of the 2010 refugee bursary. Her story brought tears to
 most eyes but she was so engaging, I would love to be able to have her at our club function. Refugee camp until 11 years old and now wants to do nursing. You can only imagine the inbetween story.
- But my favorite speaker was Ms Therese Rein who spoke on homeless women who they are and the sad facts of what makes them homeless. There is an organization called "Common ground Australia" which is worth investigating. Therese said that women are the invisible homeless. They are unaccountable because, mostly out of fear of abuse, they do not want to be found. They can sleep in cardboard boxes, in the reeds of creeks and stay hidden for fear of being raped or found by the person who abused them originally. Therese also said "life is unpredictable", as she recently found out, but when people do not have the support of a loving family, who knows what can happen.

Keryn mentioned that when men are poor, women are poorer. As you can see, the evening made a huge impact on me.

President Ros had also managed to do a lovely report on our club for NCWQ records which was great to read.

PRECIS OF THE DISTRICT **GOVERNOR'S REPORT ON** THE ZONTA INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, **25 - 30 JUNE 2010.**

1,418 Zontians and 188 guests registered for convention but 112 of 1.224 clubs were not represented at Convention. 19 new Clubs were formed during the biennium and at 31 May 2010 the total membership stood at 31,354.

Vicki and Trish gave brief details of the evening social events on offer which I shan't include - suffice to say there was plenty of Texas hospitality with down town tours, visits to a ranch, a museum, a river cruise and the closing banquet, and good times were had!

First Day Open Forum

At the open forum on the first day some of the issues that ZI president Beryl Stern openly and honestly shared at our District 22 conference in September 09 (and which those of us who were at the conference have since shared with the Club) were discussed.

The ZI Boards have taken actions to reduce the administration costs of ZI but it will still be necessary to raise our fees by US\$15 from next year. This is from the current fees of US\$65.

Members Database And Payments

A database will be available shortly on the members' only section of the ZI website for Club Presidents and Treasurers to make changes to membership lists directly, and additional membership payments will in future be possible through the use of Visa (rather than obtaining a US cheque).

Use:- goodsearch.com and goodshop.com to raise funds for ZIF If you choose to use goodsearch.com instead of google, and goodshop.com for online shopping then both these companies will give the Zonta International Foundation one cent for

each search undertaken.

The presentation of flags was a little different from the usual format were Zontians bear the flags of countries and Districts etc. Instead the flags were carried by escorts - members of the San Antonio Fire Department Honour Guard.

The keynote speaker Dr. Carolyn Hannan highlighted the role and importance of Zonta in the United Nations, always good to hear, and the ceremony concluded with lively entertainment by a team of singers, dancers and boot scooters.

Memorial Ceremony

The traditional memorial service to remember Zontians who have died in the past two years took the form of a New Orleans style service with a Jazz funeral parade.

Elections

Elections took place on the second day and the successful candidates for International Committees and District Governor positions are featured in the July 2010 Zontian.

Vicki Varthas stood as an International Director for Australia and New Zealand but was pipped to the post by Alison Martin. (I don't know which Club Alison is from, sorry).

However Jane O'Brien, formerly of the Redcliffe Club and now with Sandgate, continues as Chair of the Young Women in Public Affairs Award committee, and Denise Conroy of the Zonta Club of Brisbane East

continues as Chair of the Legislative and Awareness and Advocacy committee.

ZI Bylaws & Resolutions

I have a full list of the proposed amendments to the bylaws and rules of procedure and have marked them as whether adopted or not. The vast majority only involved deletions or additions of words without changing the meaning of the bylaw or rule, and many others were not adopted so there was no change at all. The full list will be in the correspondence file for those interested.

The only two which I (and Vicki Varthas/Trish Collins) have noted as of interest to Clubs are:

18c. Article XIV, Clubs, Section 9. Committees. P.40

"There shall be an Organization, Membership and Classification Committee, a Service committee, a Legislative Awareness and Advocacy Committee and such other committees as the Club board may authorise to achieve biennium goals."

Previously the standing committees were the ones we have now -Finance, OMC, PR, Service and UN. So this is something we will have to discuss.

The other by-law worth noting because it was NOT changed (although there had been a proposal to change it) is

21. Article XIV, Clubs, Section 2. Members (b) Classified members p.34:-

"To be invited to membership a candidate shall be actively engaged in, or have experience in, a recognised business or profession in a decision-making capacity".

Awards & Service Programs

The delegates heard from winners of the Jane M Kalsumann Women in Business Scholarship, and Young Women in Public affairs and also from UNICEF and UNIFEM representatives on the international programs. Delegates adopted the new or

continuing programs outlined in the minutes of the May dinner meeting, and which also can be found in the July Zontian.

Caroline Rickards from Melbourne is an Amelia Earhart scholarship recipient who gave a presentation at the convention as to how she had used her scholarship and how her career had evolved.

Not all financial targets were met during the biennium but the ZISVAW

fund's target of US\$600,000 was exceeded by 75,000. Unfortunately the International Service Funds target of US\$1,600,000 was only at 83% by 31 May 2010.
