It is in the committee meeting that the fun, the creativity and the recommendations happen. Those recommendations are taken to the club meeting for discussion and approval.

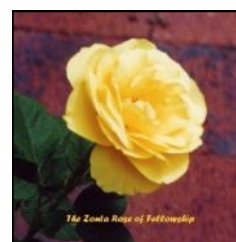
All Zontians are on a committee. If you've forgotten which one, look

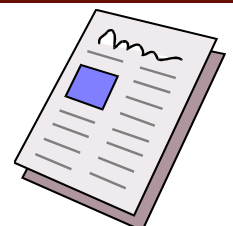

I have a friend who, when asked to submit a profile, wonders which one she will write and I so agree. After a longish life it is difficult to know what to say without terrifying people by beginning “I was born on a spring morning many years ago” – just like the beginning on a three volume Victorian saga. Well, I was.

I’m old Rockhampton- my great grandparents were married in St Paul’s in 1866. Great grandmother had a jewellery shop in Quay Lane and I have the clock which used to keep standard time for Rockhampton. Grandmother, as Mayoress, turned the switch which brought electricity to town and mother was very involved in all manner of civic duty, especially the RGGGS. So, quite a formidable female ancestral line-up.

I grew up partly in Rockhampton and partly on a cattle property, completing my schooling at the RGGGS. After finishing at the University of Queensland I went to England as we did then. I there met John whom I later married and our daughter Jane was born in London. She now practises as a vet in the south England.

Academically, I seem to have gone sideways. After dentistry at the U of Q, I later did Arts at the CQU and then Theology at Melbourne. I practised here for about 20 years. Following retirement and John’s death, I’ve stayed in town. My interests currently are gardening, travel, bridge, reading, meals-on-wheels, church work and Zonta. We have a 16 acre block near Noosa which gives me a lot of fun. I have a tractor there and am busy planting trees – 300 so far.

Why Zonta? I enjoy the friendship and companionship of members. I like the thought we are able to do some good in the local community. Also, I’ve travelled a lot and have seen appalling poverty and need about which an individual can do little. I do appreciate being in an organisation which can and does make a difference.
