#### Dear Friends

At the risk of making you all groan, last night I dreamt of Zonta. In my dream, I had to award a prize to one of our Club members - the dilemma was who to award it to as there were two equally deserving contenders. On waking I was quite relieved not to have to make this difficult decision! – but equally I thought it was not such a bad situation to be in: It simply reflected the fact that so many of our Club members are extraordinary, and put serving their community front and centre professionally and personally. Consistent with this, I think it very sensible that Clubs could nominate as many Club members as they

wished for the six Dianne Leggo unsung heroes awards. I hope very much that both our two nominees (Susan Davies and Julie Mannion) are successful (at this point, and before I get any questions about it, no, I was not dreaming about Susan and Julie specifically – but they are very deserving nominees this time!).

One of the things I like about Zonta is that in addition to supporting women and girls in dire circumstances, we also celebrate women and girls who have achieved great things; and many of our prizes aim to empower young women to take leadership roles politically, academically, and socially. This week we are awarding prizes to two young women - the Dr Helen Row Memorial Prize (for excellence in Paediatrics and Mental Health) and our Club's Jane M Klausman Women in Business award. We are delighted to welcome the awardees to our dinner meeting and congratulate them on their achievements.

At our next meeting we will be welcoming the two winners of the Babette Stephens Award for 2018. I would like to thank Gwen Jull in particular for her work in ensuring that we judge these awards as fairly as possible. It's been quite interesting to see various people's different marking styles – although ultimately we usually reach the same answer!

In considering prizes, can I urge you all to consider who you are going to nominate for the Advancement for Women Award. We want this award to reflect the high standards we aim for as a Club, and to honour the generosity of Dr Joan Godfrey, and Susan Hocking and Susan Davies (in honour of their late mothers). I'd like to thank the Advancement of Women Award Subcommittee for the huge amount of work they have put into setting this award up – it's a wonderful achievement – and to remind you that the deadline for applications is rapidly approaching.

# **\*Service News**

We are delighted to confirm the Dr Helen Row Memorial Prize and the ZI JMK Club Award will be presented to the respective winners at our August dinner meeting.

In addition, Gwen Jull, Chair of the Service Committee will be seeking approval from members to grant the following Awards:

- Leneen Forde Zonta Bursary (Griffith Uni): 14 nominations received.
- ZI Award Women in Technology: One application received.
- Cassandra Weddell Award: Two applications received.

1. Save the Children for a project (\$10,000): 'Story Swags'.

The Story Swag project supports parents/carers and their child to create a resource to further develop and enhance their child's literacy and language through the learning experience of the chosen book and additional resources created.

Population to be served: Brisbane, Gold Coast region, North Burnett and Kilcoy region. This includes correctional centre groups at Brisbane Women's Correctional Centre, Numinbah Correctional Centre and Southern Queensland Correctional Centre

2. Trinity Tots Music Box; A Trinity Commons Project (\$5,500).

Trinity Tots Music Box is aimed at pre-school children living in or around inner city Brisbane, especially Fortitude valley housing commission area. A significant proportion of attendees are people who were not born in Australia, some have limited English, and almost all of them do not have the support of their extended family. Trinity Tots offer a program once a week which focuses on the arts - music, dance, art and expressive play to create an opportunity for children from less advantaged backgrounds to learn, grow and flourish.
