Voices against Violence: A Zonta International Foundation ZISVAW Program: (ZISVAW = Zonta International Strategies to end Violence Against Women)

Voices Against Violence: Non-Formal Education Curriculum for the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts on Ending Violence against Women and Girls.

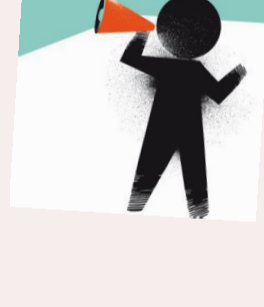
Funding: US\$986,000 to UN Women (The United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women)

The World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS) in partnership with UN Women and the support of Zonta International started the roll out of the Voices against Violence program with the first regional Training of Trainers Workshop in Pune, India, from 12—17 December 2014.

The voices against Violence curriculum teaches young people to understand gender-based violence and its root causes, identify various forms of violence prevalent globally and in their communities and explore solutions. Youth leaders create a safe place for young people to discuss and challenge gender stereotypes, attitudes and practices that condone such violence and empowers them to take action. The curriculum will be delivered by training 200 national trainers at four regional workshops, who will then return to their home countries and train at least 3000 youth leaders and educators in 12 countries through the cascading model.

The first training workshop for the Asia Pacific which took place in Pune India trained 46 trainers from the following seven countries: Fiji, India, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Philippines and Sri Lanka.

News from the Northern Hemisphere:



District 31 demonstrates Zonta power on Rose Day:

District 31 members participated in an advocacy walk to reinforce their commitment to ending violence against women.

Members demonstrated Zonta power in a Rose Day walk in Kaohsiung, Taiwan called "Walk Forward-Spread Love and Care", enforcing their commitment to the Zonta Says NO to Violence Against Women campaign. Members urged the public to join the Zonta cause seeking gender equality through service and advocacy. District 31 Governor Hsin-hsin Yang also delivered the Zonta spirit of Conviction, Commitment and Courage to 320 people joining the 7 March walk and gave scholarships to 11 high school girls studying in the San Duo area in Kaohsiung.

Joining the "Walk Forward -Spread Love " event included Zontians from the district's 18 clubs, district Z club members, government officials and local residents. Yang also announced the district's plans to assist less fortunate women in San Duo, Taiwan in acquiring skills to become financially stronger and a project collaborating with local therapists to help women recover from the trauma. Almost 60 members from the four district Z clubs also participated in the Rose Day activity as volunteers.

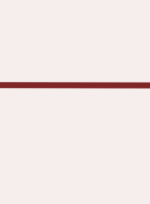
