As we prepare to celebrate our 100th anniversary in 2019, we look back on some of the most significant milestones in our rich history of empowering women worldwide through service and advocacy. Our emblem has been with us since 1919.

What appears to be the letter "Z" is actually the Sioux symbol for "ray of light,"

This Sioux symbol means "to band together for a purpose" or "to stand together"- in a

The square is neither exclusively Sioux, nor is it exclusively Native American. It is the

This composed symbol became Zonta's emblem, signifying a group of successful business executives and professionals who are loyal, honest, and trustworthy, inspired to advance the status of women worldwide through service and advocacy.

"sunshine" or "flash of radiance"- and so "inspiration.

This symbol is the Sioux way of saying "to carry together."

This symbol is the Sioux symbol for "shelter." An indoor organization.

"Zonta" is derived from a Lakhota word meaning honest and trustworthy. (Lakhota (Teton Dakota), a language of the Native-American Sioux peoples) It was adopted in 1919 to symbolize the combined qualities of honesty and trust, inspiration and the ability to work together for service and world understanding. The emblem is not simply a decorative design. It is an adaptation and composite of several Sioux Indian symbols which when
