INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PEACE SEPTEMBER 21, 2010

In 1981, the UN General Assembly established the International Day of Peace "for commemorating and strengthening the ideals of peace within and among all nations and people." It is observed every year on September 21st. It is a global call for ceasefire in conflict zones as well as for non-violence. In the 2010 message of Ban-Ki Moon, Secretary General of the United Nations, he called on the world to mark the International Day of Peace, which he called "...a day on which armed conflict is meant to be stilled...a day on which we appeal to combatants to observe a ceasefire...a day on which we reaffirm commitment to non-violence and the peaceful resolution of disputes." He also noted that during the International Year of Youth (12 August 2010 to 11 August 2011) "Young people already play a crucial role in working for peace. Yet I know they can do even more...the world's concerns will soon be in your hands." This year's observance is focusing on youth and development under the slogan "Peace=Future."

This year, the International Day of Peace occurs during the Summit I which is being convened in order to advance progress toward meeting the objectives of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs). According to the Secretary General, "Achieving the goals is essential for ending armed conflict and building sustainable peace."

Because the International Day of Peace falls in the middle of the Millennium Development Goals Summit, it will be observed on Friday, 17 September, at 8:45 a.m. with the traditional Peace Bell Ceremony by the Secretary General in the Rose Garden at UN headquarters. Zonta has a long history of involvement with the United Nations dating back to our support for its formation. Zonta gained consultative status at the United Nations in 1969 and has held that status ever since. Back in 1946 a resolution titled "Action for World Peace" was adopted by Zonta International. Having just experienced World War II, the members were obviously eager for the world to understand the devastation that had occurred and to agree to peaceful resolutions to conflicts or disputes.

JANE M. KLAUSMAN WOMEN IN BUSINESS SCHOLARSHIP

Women have made great strides in the pursuit of education, careers and leadership roles they were once denied; however, today, women are still more likely to be pouring the coffee in global boardrooms than sitting on the boards. In 2009, women held only 15.2% of the board seats at Fortune 500 companies according to the Catalyst organization. The Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarship program helps women pursue undergraduate and Master's degrees in business management and overcome gender barriers from the classroom to the boardroom.

Since the program's inception, Zonta has awarded 199 scholarships to women from 34 countries.

SCHOLARSHIP DESCRIPTION

Established in 1998 from a generous bequest by Jane M. Klausman, a member of the Zonta Club of Syracuse, New York USA, and the 1990-1995 Zonta International Parliamentarian, the Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarship is awarded annually to women pursuing undergraduate or Master's degrees in business management.

The program operates at the Zonta club, district and international levels. Zonta clubs provide awards for club recipients. Zonta International awards scholarships of US\$1,000 each at the district level and twelve international scholarships in the amount of US\$5,000 each. The Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarships are awarded annually and may be used for tuition, books or living expenses at any university, college or institution offering accredited business courses and degrees.

ELIGIBILITY

Women pursuing a business or business-related degree who demonstrate outstanding potential in the field are eligible. Online students are also eligible. Members and employees of Zonta International or the Zonta International Foundation are not eligible to apply for the Scholarships.

APPLICATION PROCESS

The Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarship program operates at the club, district and international levels of Zonta International. Applicants must be nominated by a local Zonta club. Applications selected by Zonta clubs are sent to their respective Zonta District Governors. A district evaluating committee selects one applicant per district to submit to Zonta International Headquarters. The Zonta International Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarship Committee selects twelve international recipients from the district applicants.

DEADLINE

Applications must be completed and presented to Zonta clubs according to the club's assigned deadline. A club recipient is selected, and the application is presented to the District Governor by 1 July 2010. The district recipient is selected, and the application is presented to Zonta International Headquarters by 1 September 2010. International recipients will be contacted by their Zonta club leader by mid October 2010.

FUNDING SUPPORT

Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarships are made possible through investment income generated by the Klausman bequest, and by generous contributions from Zontians, Zonta clubs and friends of Zonta.

Quiz Questions Answered

Page 145

Suspension or Expulsion

a. Any member of the Club who has acted in a way to injure the good name of Zonta or hamper its work may be expelled by the Club members. A complaint in writing against a member for such behaviour may be made to the Club Board. The board shall refer the complaint to a committee appointed by the Club Board for investigation (or a committee elected by the Club if the complaint is against a Club officer, per Article VII Section 6).

The complaint shall include specific charges and available evidence. The committee shall give the member concerned an opportunity to respond in writing and may hold a hearing with the member concerned, the complainant and witnesses if any.

Thereafter the committee shall make a recommendation to the Club Board. If the Club Board determines that further action regarding expulsion is necessary, it shall make a recommendation to the Club members for a decision at a meeting of which written notice has been given to all members. The member concerned shall be entitled to be present for consideration of action to be taken but shall not be entitled to vote. A 2/3 ballot vote of Club members present and voting shall be necessary for expulsion of a member.

Notice of the Board or Club decision shall be mailed with proof of service to the complainant and to the member concerned forthwith. The decision of the Club Board or Club members may be appealed by the complainant or the member concerned to the District Board within 45 days from the date on which the notice of decision is mailed to the parties. Expulsion shall be by a 2/3 ballot vote of the entire elected District Board. The decision of the District Board shall be mailed with proof of service to the complainant and to the member concerned forthwith.

The decision of the District Board may be appealed by the parties to the Zonta International Board within 45 days from the date on which the notice of decision is mailed to the parties. Expulsion shall be by a 2/3 ballot vote of the entire Zonta International Board. The decision of the Zonta International Board shall be final.

If the Club fails to act, the complainant can refer the matter to the District Board which shall initiate disciplinary proceedings. If the District Board fails to act, the complainant can refer the matter to the Zonta International Board which has full authority to initiate proceedings and to impose discipline on its own.

Page195 Rose Fund

b. The Rose Fund is the Foundation Annual Operating and Program Support Fund. Named for the Zonta Rose, the Rose Fund supports all facets of the Foundation's operations, including the technical and professional support systems necessary for quality management, as well as the enhancement and expansion of service programs.
