Bonjour Ladies:





Kerry, thank-you for your time with this profile it's great to know a bit more about you.



Activities around the World

Zonta Club Aschaffenburg Area (Germany) provides two young women with a job as cooks as well as food for about 25 elderly people on a daily basis.

Moldova is the poorhouse of Europe. Clamped between Romania's Carpathian Mountains and the vast fields of Ukraine most people overlook the tiny country and its 4.5 million inhabitants. Despite the small size of Moldova the country's problems are huge. Three quarter of its population live below the poverty line. Especially old people are fighting for survival, because their pension is less than the minimum of \$US40 needed to survive. Meanwhile many often young and well-educated people have left the country in search for a better life.

Unfortunately, the new life all too often turns out to be worse than the old one. Especially women and teenagers often fall prey to criminals and end up as slave laborers or prostitutes. Although it is difficult to find exact numbers the German embassy in Chisinau, Moldova's capital, and the International Organization for Migration (IOM) have confirmed that trafficking business in Moldova is booming.

To help young women in Moldova to find a job Zonta Club Aschaffenburg Area, Germany decided in 2004 to sponsor a soup kitchen in the Moldovan village Costesti. About 25 elderly people receive a free lunch there daily. The food is being cooked by two Moldovan women in their early 20s. Since Spring 2005 Zonta is not only paying the women's monthly pay, but also financing the food.

"This initiative is only a small step toward solving the immense problems of the people and especially women in Moldova," wrote Zontian Inken Heeb. "Therefore getting involved in Moldova in different projects or expanding Zonta's anti-trafficking program to Moldova could not only be rewarding but also a truly Zontian challenge."
