ZONTA KNOWLEDGE - Educating the members

Legislative Awareness and Advocacy

A major goal for the 2010-2012 Biennium is to ELIMINATE all advocacy/service projects which DO NOT meet one or more of Zonta's Objects. Do the following meet the objects?

1. Contributions to domestic violence safe house (personal care items, furnishings, clothing).

<u>YES</u> Any support for women domestic violence victims meets Zonta's Object of promoting justice and universal respect for human rights. It also meets CEDAW Article 3.

2. 'Tech savvy' programme to support young women getting into science/computing field.

<u>YES</u> This supports improving the educational status and economic status of women by assisting women to enter a non-traditional educational field and further their employment prospects. It meets CEDAW Article 4 (Special Measures) and Article 10.

3. Seminar on equal pay for men and women.

<u>YES</u> Any seminar which educates both men and women about the principles of equality between the sexes (be it pay or any other matter) meets CEDAW Article 2. Women should not be discriminated against on the basis of their sex.

4. Making/assembling birthing kits for distribution overseas.

<u>YES</u> Birthing kits provide 'access' to health care services which would otherwise not be available to women due to their extreme poverty and/or living in areas remote from post natal care. It meets CEDAW Article 12.

5. Support for regional oncology wellness centre.

NO Does not meet any 'status of women' criteria. If the oncology wellness centre was for women it would meet 'improving women's health – CEDAW Article 12. As a general rule, Zonta clubs should not be funding activities which are a government responsibility (heath treatment facilities). In such cases where funding is needed, we should advocate that the responsible government provides this service.

6. Relay for life for cancer society.

NO Does not meet any 'status of women' criteria. Cancer societies are usually charitable organisations whereas Zonta clubs (outside the USA) cannot achieve this status due to tax laws. Cancer is an 'emotive' issue but not one for Zonta clubs a we focus on empowering the status of women.

7. Gifts to aged women.

NO A nice thing to do but it does not improve the 'status' of the women according to Znta's Objects.

8. Providing infants' cots for nursery ward at a local hospital.

NO This does not meet any 'status of women' criteria. In developed countries provision of hospital equipment is the responsibility of the state (if a public hospital) or hospital administration if a private facility. Most hospitals in developed countries have their own foundations and fundraising activities.

Riyawat - the movie:

Several Zontians and partners attended this revealing film produced by Prof Ajay Rane and shown last Thursday evening to a large group of people at the Kalamia.

It hi-lighted the reprehensible practice that has been the culture in India and worldwide for generations, by both the rich and the poor, the killing of girl babies in the womb (feticide) and after birth (infanticide).

The aim of the producers is to not only expose this practice but to force those living where it is happening, even doctors, to accept that it does occur.

Whilst the ratio of girls to boys should be 1005 girls to 1000 boys, in India it is 876 girls to 1000 boys.

Breast Cushions

Karen has recently made contact with the Breast Cancer Nurses from the Mater and the Townsville Hospital, and she has spoken to one of the surgeons. They do receive cushions from Charters Towers and Townsville but do have the need for more. Our committee would like to see the club make some more cushions, for distribution to both the hospitals and to Shirley Gilmore. We would also like to recommend to the hospitals that 2 cushions are given to each patient.

SoW Chairman's Report for year ending May 2010.

The SOW committee comprised of Karen Clarke (Chair), Giovanna Gabiola, Jill Giddy, Leith Kennedy, Margaret Williams and Sandi Milani.

We had a successful year and managed to have regular committee meetings with a minimum of 3 but usually 4 or 5 members making every meeting. We enjoyed our lunches as we felt that we had the time to combine a social event with the meeting which gave us the opportunity to have time to get to know each other a little better as well as attending to club and committee business. We enjoyed the idea of lunch as it gave us the leeway of taking an hour or a little longer to cover the agenda.

We had an easy start to the Zonta year as our major goals were not until February and March when we had the birthing kits, IWD Breakfast and the Community Spirit Award within the space of just over a fortnight.

This year the Birthing Kits were assembled on 21st February and we managed to make 999 kits in the space of about 4 hours. 12 ladies attended including a non –Zontian. We used to take 2 days to assemble the kits and this year the reduced time was due to Giovanna and her family cutting and packaging the black plastic in the zip lock bags in advance. A special thank you to them. We only sent 999 kits away to Afghanistan as we kept a kit for display at the IWD Breakfast. Peta kindly donated the use of her office to assemble the kits and Mary and Raelene provided the bulk of the morning tea – thank you. The price of the kits has increased to \$2 kit. We plan to investigate assembling the kits next year in conjunction with a school as the price is then only \$1 so for the same club commitment we could assemble twice as many kits. Over 500,000 kits have been assembled in Australia so far since the project commenced and 80,000 have been sent to Afghanistan. At the Area Meeting last month it was wonderful to hear directly from Amanda Baker a midwife who has had 4 stints in Thailand where she has been teaching the nearby Burmese Traditional Birthing Assistants how to use the kits for more hygienic births. Mortality rates have been reduced by 50%.

The International Women's Day Breakfast was held on Monday 8th March at Cloves. We had an excellent attendance with approximately 63 ladies attending and one gentleman. As usual Cloves provided a delicious breakfast and a well decorated venue. Our guest speaker was Aileen Cull, the CEO of the QCCU who gave an enthralling talk on her rise to the top of a large financial organisation after previously taking time out to spend years sailing round Asia and the Pacific in a yacht fulfilling a special dream. Aileen's theme was that women can achieve their goals in the work force as well as pursuing personal goals which may take them out of the work force for some time – study, raising a family or as in Aileen's case, chasing a dream. This year we had a few high school students attend the breakfast and we hope they took away this message. \$953 was raised which went towards the birthing kits.

Community Spirit Award – we received 3 nominations and the winner was Audrey Dean. Audrey is a very active member with the 2 local Aged Homes and an aged care facility in Townsville. She helps organise fund raising, social events and plays the piano accordion for the residents, and is a bit of a wit. This year, the committee decided to only contact those clubs or organisations who were likely to nominate someone for the awards.

Thanks to Giovanna and Sandi who donated gifts for the guest speaker and for the raffle. Thank you also to Peta the MC, Mary for her vote of thanks to the speaker and Jan for announcing the winner of the Community Spirit Award.


