I will briefly let you know about the Zoom AGM meeting. There were 52 members who attended the Zoom meeting from District 22.

Motion 1 District 22 members confirm support for Zonta Australia and commit to working with Districts 23 and 24 in establishing the website, a governance structure and advocacy priorities. Motion was carried All 3 Districts will contribute equally to funds

District 23 has offered to do the website to save funds

Cost to consider: -

Cost of domain name and setup costs. Where to setup up still to be decided

District 22 has \$7000 in their funds at the moment. This was raised from the Auction prior to convention

Motion 2 District 22 allocate \$1000 from membership fund to an inaugural Women in Stem district award for 2024-2026.

Opportunities for ongoing funding will be investigated by the Women in Stem committee and be presented at District Conference in 2025.

An amended motion was put forward to increase the amount to \$2000. This was agreed upon by everyone. Motion was carried

This is now a Permanent award.

Expression of interest will be sent to all clubs soon to see if they want to participate.

After reviewing our budget and spending throughout the year, it was decided that we could afford \$500.00.

The Committee then discussed the Sandra Cooke STEM Award and the Banksia Awards, and it was agreed that publicity to promote the STEM was the best way to attract potential applicants.

Letters have been sent to all schools re the Banksia Awards with Carmichael College being a new school this year and Alta 1 deciding that they already have too many awards for their student cohort. Lynda Galway to be asked to print the Banksia Award Certificates as schools advise of the winner's name. Patricia will purchase the Gift Cards (\$50 each) as necessary.

We have received a request from Ali Heeps from Richardson & Wrench Caboolture for donations to Back to School program.

This is a new program, designed to assist school children returning to school in 2025. Many children are disadvantaged by poverty and the ability of their parents being able to provide for them.

As we are supporters of the Annual Chaplaincy Program the Committee decided that we would like to donate \$500.00 of vouchers to assist the organisers buy the items needed for children.

Sue will put forward a motion at the September Dinner Meeting for this to be approved. Lyn & Karen need to buy material for more breast cushions, seat belt buddies and drainage bags.

We have money covered in the budget for this purchase. Lyn, Karen & Meleitta to make arrangements to go to East Coast Fabrics Lawnton.

- Lights in Caboolture Town Square organised.

# Constitution/Bylaws Report September 2024

At this stage there two matters regarding clubs in decisions made at Convention:

# 1. Eligibility of Clubs.

However the statement passed is referred to in the International part of their bylaws/constitution. Reference is made also to the Zonta Club Manual, not Club Bylaws/Constitutions, regarding organisation of clubs.

#### 2. Resolution re Golden Z Members

Golden Z members will become youth members of the sponsoring club, area and district for statistical purposes but not for credentials or voting.

There are details of involvement with the sponsoring club. However there is no indication if statements about Golden Z members need to put into the clubs constitution/bylaws. There is reference to 'a pilot project' regarding their status as 'youth members'
