ADVOCACY COMMITTEE REPORT Tuesday 4 October

The Orange figures to be prepared with new signage for the ladies. The signage gives the name and age of woman and or child who died of a result of Domestic Violence in the last 12 months.

There are two new facilities willing to take the orange figures for the 16 days of Activism. We will check with the usual libraries and businesses if they are prepared to house the orange families again this year.

So far we have all the 46 orange figures allocated, 2 banners are to be erected at Apex Park and Sheep Station Creek, the Caboolture Square to be lit up with Orange lightning and promotion on local radio station. We are seeking permission from Morayfield Shopping Centre to man a stall in the Centre sometime over the 16 days of Activism from 25th November to 10th December

The Coercive Control Symposium was a success. The Advocacy committee is very appreciative of the support and assistance that other club members gave us. The Advocacy Committee is also very appreciative of the financial assistance given to us from local MPs.

We are planning another Symposium in May 2023. This time we are looking at local Gyms running skipping, jumping or similar events and maybe sponsorship for Domestic Violence month of May.

The floral garden at Burpengary Police Station. Bunnings Morayfield have offered to supply the plants for this garden. Carole to meet with 2 Bunnings representatives to discuss and plan this garden.
