My thanks to Loris and Kerstin for their work on our May fundraiser – Menopause the Musical. It was a great show and everyone enjoyed themselves. Whilst the theatre outing raised \$500 for our fundraising account, it was also a good fellowship activity.

As I reported at our AGM this month, our last year has a been a very active and busy one for members as we continued with a number of our service projects as well as adding two major projects, welcoming new members to our Club and enjoying a number of fellowship outings.

Work on our combined Clubs project LOVE BiTES continues to progress well. A LOVE BiTES Working Group has been established to guide and oversee implementation of the training. An initial meeting was convened on 16 May 2016. The Working Group recognised that whilst training is the focus of the project, it is critical to look at this project in the long term to ensure young people get the most benefit, programs are sustained and owned locally and a range of community, government groups and NGOs can have input.

Thus three hubs will be established – Metropolitan South Hub, Metropolitan North and North Coast Hub and a Metropolitan West Hub. Local committees will be established in these Hubs to assist schools in planning for and implementing the program and then to sustain any further training. Training dates have also been set for September and schools will now be notified of the dates and provided with information about LOVE BiTES for distribution to staff and parents and the required contributions from schools ie art classroom space, art supplies and funds for a hip hop artist.

Schools will be asked to submit an expression of interest for staff to be trained. The Working Group will again meet on 1 August to consider the expressions of interest. Again many thanks to Barbara for her work on this project.

I would like to end this Patter on a congratulatory note to Phoebe for winning the District YWPA Award. Fingers crossed for the Zonta International selection outcome.

Zonta in Australia

Over the past weekend the Zonta Club of Melbourne on Yarra (District 23) celebrated 50 years of Zonta in Australia. The Club's Charter was presented at 24 May 1966. Congratulations to the Zontians of the Zonta Club of Melbourne on Yarra.



The first Zonta Club in Australia was established in 1929 in Sydney and included Australian poet, Dorothea Mackellar, among its members.

While the Club disbanded in 1935, a Canadian Zontian, Dorothy Thompson, reintroduced Zonta International in Australia and New Zealand in 1965 with the organisation of 12 Clubs, one in each Australian capital city and five in New Zealand. These Clubs became District 16 of Zonta International.

By 1990, the number of clubs in District 16 had grown to the extent that, at the Zonta International Convention in Dallas in 1990, District 16 was divided into 3 separate Districts: District 16 (New Zealand), District 23 (Victoria, Tasmania, Western Australia, South Australia, and the Northern Territory), and District 24 (Queensland, New South Wales, and the Australian Capital Territory).

Further growth in Clubs and membership led to a decision at the 2008 Zonta International Convention to divide District 24 into two Districts: District 22 (Queensland and the Northern Rivers of New South Wales) and District 24 (the remainder of New South Wales and the Australian Capital Territory).

District 22 has 43 Clubs from Cairns in the North and Mount Isa and Longreach in the west to Lismore in the Northern Rivers of New South Wales.

The District has more than 1,100 active and engaged members including two former International Presidents of Zonta International: Leneen Forde AC who served for the 1990-1992 biennium; and Mary Magee OAM who served for the 2000-2002 biennium.


