I always seem to start with...it has been a busy month. Well July certainly has been extremely busy, starting with the Cannon Hill sausage sizzle on 2 July, then the Trivia Afternoon on 22 July and then to finish, the Morningside Festival on the 30th.

A huge thank you to our members and Hon Zons for their work and support this month. It has been a very successful month and our funding base for our projects has certainly increased quite significantly. As often said, for a small group we punch well above our level and our capacity to fund a range of local projects is an example of this.

As you are aware, this year we have set funds aside to once again purchase household items, linen and personal packs for ZigZag, the Young Women's Resource Centre.

Jane from ZigZag, spoke with us at our monthly meeting about the Centre. ZigZag has been operational for some 30 years and has two teams of workers - one focusing on sexual violence and the second team on housing and homelessness. For an organisation of ten part-time staff,



the support team provides a valuable support service to young women. Why focus on young women aged, 12 -25? As Jane shared with us this group is the highest most likely to experience sexual violence and or homelessness. Zig Zag is a feminist organisation giving a voice, visibility and support to those marginalised young women. It operates 9 housing units in two unit blocks at Carina and Greenslopes. The Units are occupied by single mothers predominantly from the Brisbane region.

Throughout the year we aim to raise awareness of our Club and Zonta and have a major goal in the Strategic Plan to grow our membership. For the past four years, July has been the month where we particularly focus on this objective with our stall at the Morningside Festival.

Many thanks once again to members for your support. The logistics of organising the day, packing cars, setting up and pulling down is often forgotten so to all our members and HonZons who helped on the day a huge thank you.

International News (from the July 2017 ZI E-Newsletter)



From 10-19 July, Member States of the United Nations (UN), agencies of the UN and NGO representatives will attend the High-Level Political Forum (HLPF) at the UN in New York.

The HLPF is responsible for the follow-up and review of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the Sustainable Development Goals. The theme of the HLPF this year was

"Eradicating poverty and promoting prosperity in a changing world" and the review will focus on the following goals:

- Goal 1. End poverty in all its forms everywhere
- Goal 2. End hunger, achieve food security and improved nutrition and promote sustainable agriculture
- Goal 3. Ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all at all ages
- · Goal 5. Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls
- Goal 9. Build resilient infrastructure, promote inclusive and sustainable industrialization and foster innovation
- Goal 14. Conserve and sustainably use the oceans, seas and marine resources for sustainable development

International News (from the July 2017 ZI E-Newsletter) - Cont

As part of the review process, member states are encouraged to "conduct regular and inclusive reviews of progress at the national and sub-national levels". These national reviews should facilitate the sharing of experiences, challenges and lessons learned, with a view to accelerating the implementation of the 2030 Agenda, and are expected to serve as the basis for regular reviews by the HLPF. In 2017, **44 countries** volunteered to present their national voluntary reviews to the HLPF.

NGOs with consultative status with ECOSOC are also invited to submit reports to the HLPF. Zonta International, therefore, prepared a statement to the HLPF on the contributions of Zonta International and our Zonta clubs to the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals.
