

World Population Day II July

This year the focus on World Population is on young people. In her statement, the *UNFPA Executive Director, Thoraya Obaid,* remarks "All over the world, young people want to be heard and involved. They possess the ideas, determination and energy to accelerate effective action to reduce poverty and inequality. It is clear that the Millennium Development Goals will not be met unless young people are actively involved in policy making and programming, their voices are heard, their needs are met and their human rights are respected."

"The theme of this year's World Population Day 'One billion adolescents: the right to health, information and services' highlights the need to support young people in their efforts to lead safe, rewarding lives and contribute to the well-being of their families and communities. Information and services are also crucial in the fight against AIDS and the broader guest for good health. Young people should know how the HIV virus is transmitted, and how to protect themselves from infection. Throughout the world, millions of boys and girls are deprived of an education, harming their individual prospects and those of society at large. In some countries, half of all girls are married before the age of 18, often resulting in early child-bearing that poses serious health risks to both mother and child. Experience shows that educated women are more likely to marry later, and have healthy and better educated children who will pass on these benefits from one generation to the next. Education and information also influence how many children they will have. If a woman were to wait until age 23, instead of age 18, to have her first child, that alone could reduce the momentum in population growth by over 40%.

One of every six people on earth is an adolescent. In the developing world, more than 40% of the population is under age 20. The decisions these young people make will shape our world and the prospects of future generations. On this World Population Day, let us recognise their right to health, information and services they need and deserve."

As you know, our District 24 is a member of the Australian Women's Coalition (AWC). The Australian Federation of Medical Women is also a member, the representative of which sent the following email.

Patricia Lawson, Gov District 24

"Most women will go for the mammogram and breast screen when in fact a good general exam (including blood pressure) and screening blood tests is more likely to save their life. In a developed country Death from Heart disease, cerebrovascular disease and diabetes = 47% of women's Compared with Death from breast cancer = 4%. 'This does not mean you should not have your pap smear and mammogram - but it does indicate other "things" should be done to decrease your chance of death!"

Lucy's homecoming


