# Domestic and Family Violence Prevention month 1<sup>st</sup> to 31<sup>st</sup> May

seeks to provide members of Queensland communities with an increased awareness of the social and personal impacts of domestic and family violence. In 2007, the main focus of the month is to encourage people who use abuse and/or violence to take responsibility for their abusive behaviour and seek support to change.

The 2007 Theme "Domestic and Family Violence: See the signs. Be the solution" aims to encourage men to see the warning signs of domestic and family violence, such as controlling what their partner wears, who she sees, where she goes, how much she spends – and seek advice.

Everyone is encouraged to get involved in events throughout Queensland. Remembrance Day candle lighting ceremonies in South Brisbane, Cairns, Toowoomba and Gympie, a free family fun day in Mackay, music festival in Hervey Bay, and Peaceful Walks and Tree Planting in Brisbane.

### **Modern Day Slavery**

Mark Copland Media Release – Friday 23 March 2007

Social Justice Commission Recognises 200 Years Since Abolition of Trans Atlantic Slave Trade

"The 25th March is a historic day that all people of good will can acknowledge and celebrate," stated Executive Officer for the Social Justice Commission, Dr Mark Copland. "Whenever people struggle to uphold human rights and the dignity of the human person it is worth celebrating. On March 25th, 1807, King George III gave his royal assent to the Act which abolished the slave trade. This great moment in history owes much to people of faith and good will refusing to believe that human beings should ever be debased in such a way. "

"Today our world is faced with another form of slavery – that of human trafficking. It is estimated that between 700000 and two million persons are trafficked globally each year. Of these approximately 80% are women and girls and up to 50% are minors. This trade in human beings earns up to \$A18 billion worldwide every year."

In the same way that the community organised to bring about the abolition of the trans Atlantic slave trade 200 years ago – community groups and faith based organisations need to stand against this modern form of slavery today.

"It is wonderful that the Zonta Club of Toowoomba is publicly honouring Freedom Day and encouraging all of us to do more to prevent the international crime that is human trafficking. I am proud to stand with Zonta on this special day and on this most important issue."

"Two hundred years ago William Wilberforce, the great abolitionist campaigner saw many years of hard work bring about the end to slavery. Today we all need to be a champion like Wilberforce and work to bring about an end to human trafficking."

# President Olivia Ferry - Zontian April 2007

"Zontians are amazing! Around the world we are engaged in amazing things that generate amazing results. The scale and scope of Zonta's service activities around the world are now reported quarterly by Zonta clubs in terms of the type of service provided, the number of hours spent and the amount of money raised. During just the first quarter of the biennium, based on a fraction of the clubs around the world reporting, Zontians donated 61,500 local service hours equating to 1.92 hours of service per Zontian, and raised US\$473,991 for local service equating to US\$14.79 per Zontian.

Please be sure to check the ZI Web site and report your club activities to your District Governor. Reporting not just your service activities but also your advocacy actions and member ship information will help Zonta International profile the organization's activities and track progress towards the achievement of our biennial goals. This biennium we want to listen to our members more. It is part of our bottom-up strategy to guide the future direction of the organization."

## Zonta International Honorary Member selected as Judge in Cambodian War Crimes Tribunal

Dame Silvia Cartwright, a Zonta International Honorary member since 2001 and Keynote Speaker at the Zonta International Convention in Melbourne in 2006, is serving as one of only two international judges in the Trial Chamber of the Tribunal for former members of the Khmer Rouge regime in Cambodia.

The three-year tribunal is set to start in mid-2007. This tribunal is very important for the Cambodian people who suffered so much during the Khmer Rouge period. They want to see a fair and transparent tribunal.

Dame Silvia, whose term as Governor-General of New Zealand ended in August 2006, was not ready for retirement. She chose instead to return to her profession as a lawyer and judge when she applied for the Cambodia War Crimes Tribunal position after the United Nations call for interest from judges. The Tribunal will be drawing on the experience of other war crimes tribunals, but will be guided by Cambodian law, she said. This would take Dame Silvia out of her comfort zone. "It's going to be quite a challenging experience," she said. "Here in New Zealand it's challenging enough to work under law that I know well.""

Monika Auweter-Kurtz was named the President of the University of Hamburg, Germany in November 2006. She is the first female president of one of Germany's largest universities. Currently a member of the Zonta Club of Stuttgart, Ms Auweter-Kurtz was an Amelia Earhart Fellow from 1979-80 and 1980-81. She has served on the International Amelia Earhart Subcommittee since 1990.

Dr Claire Tomlin, an aviation engineer and Amelia Earhart fellow from 1996-7 and 1997-8 has been awarded the prestigious MacArthur Fellowship – more commonly known as the "Genius Award." This award is an unrestricted grant intended to allow recipients to pursue their own intellectual and professional inclinations, and is awarded based on a candidate's "exceptional creativity, promise for important future advances based on a track record of significant accomplishments and potential for the fellowship to facilitate subsequent creative work."
