International Day of the Girl Child: 11 October 2013

Kathy Payne, Social Worker, has been invited to attend our October Dinner meeting on 15th October to discuss the Shine Program; Jenny E will present on the international theme.

Observance of this day provides an opportunity to raise public awareness of the different types of discrimination and abuse that many girls suffer. The theme for the 2013 International Day of the Girl Child is 'Innovating for Girls' Education'.

All UN agencies, Member States, civil society organizations, and private sector actors have potential tools to innovate for and with girls to advance their education. The following are just some of many examples:


- Improving public and private means of transportation for girls to get to school—from roads, buses, mopeds, bicycles to boats and canoes
- Engaging young people in monitoring and holding school systems accountable for ensuring the integrity of school facilities and functions and the safety and learning of girls

- Collaboration between school systems and the banking industry to facilitate secure and convenient pay delivery to female teachers and scholarship delivery to girls
- Provision of science and technology courses targeted at girls in schools, universities and vocational education programmes
- Corporate mentorship programmes to help girls acquire critical work and leadership skills and facilitate their transition from school to work
- Revisions of school curricula to integrate positive messages on gender norms related to violence, child marriage, sexual and reproductive health, and male and female family roles
- Deploying mobile technology for teaching and learning to reach girls, especially in remote areas
- Using traditional and social media, advertising and commercial packaging to publicise data on gender disparities in education, the underlying causes, and actions that can be taken for change

The International Day of the Girl Child 2013 will provide a platform to highlight examples such as these – and many more – of ongoing work and achievements, as well as raise awareness of the importance of innovation in advancing girls' education and promoting learning and empowerment.

Birthing Kits:

We were very pleased to receive this email from Adrian Harris, Supplies and Logistics Officer at Birthing Kit Foundation (Australia)

‘ It is with great pleasure that I am emailing you today to inform you that the 1000 birthing kits that were assembled, by yourself (Zonta Club of Warwick Inc), students and fellow volunteers and sent back to our warehouse in Adelaide in May were forwarded on to one of our partners, Mission in Health Care and Development in Luvungi, Uvira, DR Congo. These arrived on the 27th of August and are scheduled to be delivered in the local area in conjunction with traditional midwife training. This was part of a 13,000 kit order that was sent in a container along with medical supplies and other sundry supplies to assist in the kitting out of a recently built rural hospital. DR Congo is one particular area we are targeting as their infant and maternal rate of death or disability is one of the highest in the world. This has also been of utmost importance at the moment due to recent rebel attacks causing much localised displacement of people including many deaths.

From the correspondence that I have already received from our partner group, they are thrilled to be able to provide a clean, safe birthing site for their current expecting mothers and are so appreciative that others in the world “care”.

On behalf of the foundation, partner groups and final recipients we would like to thank you so much for all of your assistance. The donation of time, money and effort has a tremendous impact on the maternal and infantile health in the areas of need that your birthing kits have been sent to. We can never underestimate the value of these kits in providing the simple requirements for a sterile birthing site.

Please pass on our thanks to all of the participants, and we look forward to hearing from you in the future’.
