From 2016 through 2020 Zonta International contributed US\$2,000,000 to UNICEF USA to support the [Let Us Learn Madagascar](#) project. In 2020, Zonta International announced an additional commitment of US\$500,000 to support Phase III. Specific objectives are to:

- Ensure that more children, particularly girls (who drop out at higher levels in the post-primary level) have access to post-primary education and stay in school.
- Ensure that Madagascar's education system has the capacity to offer quality teaching for enhanced learning outcomes.

2020-2022

Funding: US\$500,000 to UNICEFUSA

Objectives:

- Around 100 children will learn in two new classrooms, which will be complete with latrines, a water point, and equipment.
- 100 schools will receive pedagogical materials annually.
- 100 school principals will be trained.
- 100 follow-up monitoring visits and activities will be conducted by the pedagogical support officers.
- 750 households will benefit from conditional cash transfers.
- 700 children (at least 50 percent girls) will be reintegrated into school after attending catch-up classes.
- 3,500 children will have increased knowledge of life skills that support their well-being and healthy development.
- Eight school districts will be supported to implement a code of conduct against violence in schools and to develop a functional intake and referral mechanism for child victims of violence and exploitation.
- 114 children's clubs will be established to implement plans of action to raise awareness in their schools and communities about the issue of violence.
- 1,600 children at risk and victims of violence and exploitation in schools and communities will benefit from medical, legal, or social support.

Member's Biographies: This month it is me, Denise Martin and I have been a member for 17 years.



Although I went to school here in Beaudesert, I don't know that you could call me a "local" like Margie Brennan!

Born at Ashgrove Hospital while Mum and Dad worked in Mungallala, a small town west of Roma. In 1952 Dad got a job as the Grocery manager of the Tamrookum Co-op in Beaudesert and we lived behind the cordial factory in Gordon St. I started school at the Beaudesert State Rural and High School (now called Primary School) in 1953 and am happy to say I still keep in touch with a lot who were in that 1953 class.

I left school in April 1961 because Dad was ill and Mum had 5 children and a shop to run. So I worked in the shop, which is now the Caltex servo at the bypass but then it was a little corner store with 2 bowsers outside. In 1963 I went to live with my aunt in Stafford and worked at the BCC (later Woolworths supermarket) at the Chermside Shopping Centre.

In 1970 I went overseas at the urging of friends and returned in 1973 having stopped in Israel for almost a year on the way home. I started working at the old Jimboomba Hotel and I worked in hotels for several years which included about 6 years at the Exhibition with the Sullivans. In 1975 my old friend, Haydn Sargent, offered me a manager's job at his Indooroopilly nursery where I stayed for several years. I never had a career but worked at various interesting jobs—I made biscuits with a friend for many years, was a relocation consultant for overseas clients, did B&B during Expo, took in overseas students (over 100), here to learn English...After my divorce I went to Roma and worked in a Medical Centre until my retirement in 2007.

The call came in 2009 that the house next to Mum was available in Elysium Village and within a month I sold my house in Roma and moved into #14. After 46 years away I "came home" again. Mum rocks on in Wongaburra at aged 97 and, as she has an older sister, I fear I will be around a long time!

Travelling turned out to be a passion of mine; I've managed to go overseas 23 times, which includes 10 times to the USA. Who knows if I will travel again when life returns to normal???

I am so grateful for having joined Zonta. I joined in Roma in 2003 and have met so many beautiful people here and overseas during the years.
