## MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT:

Dear fellow Zontians,

November is already here and we are approaching a very busy time for our club. Jane, Ellen and I spent a pleasant morning selling raffle tickets for our Christmas hampers last Friday and we started the ball rolling. I hope as many of you as possible can add your names to the roster so that we can get a great many tickets sold before the Gourmet Goodies Day at Beaudesert Markets on 2<sup>nd</sup> December.

On 2<sup>nd</sup> November the Office for Women and Domestic Violence Reform released *The Queensland Violence against Women Prevention Plan 2016-22*. The Plan has been designed to address the gendered nature of violence against women and represents the final piece of the Queensland policy framework to address violence against women and children in Queensland. The 8<sup>th</sup> November is the birthday of Zonta International. From small beginnings in Buffalo USA in 1919 Zonta has grown to 30,000 members in 1,200 clubs in 66 countries. We will celebrate the centenary in 2019. But prior to that, we will need to think about how we will celebrate our Club's 30<sup>th</sup> birthday in 2018. The planning for this will need to happen next year, so ideas will be sought from you all early in the new year.

The 25<sup>th</sup> November is the United Nations International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women. Zonta Clubs traditionally mark this important November day by holding 16 Days of Activism to raise awareness about violence against women and its impact on women's physical, psychological, social and spiritual well-being. Here in the Beaudesert Area we will commence our activism to raise awareness of domestic violence issues on the 25<sup>th</sup> (also White Ribbon Day) with displays outside the Mitre 10 Store in William Street. Details will be worked out at our November meeting.

There was an interesting item on ABC Radio recently relating to the possibility that bones discovered on Nikumaroro Island in 1941 may have been those of Amelia Earhart. At the time, the theory was dismissed, as it was thought they were male remains. However, after recent forensic anthropological evaluation, The International Group for Historical Aircraft Recovery (TIGHAR) now suggests that the partial skeleton could have been that of Amelia Earhart. It is thought she may have lived as a castaway on the island for a time after her aircraft came down. After listening to the story on the radio, I looked it up on Google. You may find it interesting to read about, as she is an inspirational former member of Zonta.

Zonta International celebrates 97 years of changing lives of women and girls  
8<sup>th</sup> November 2016

Zonta International was established on 8<sup>th</sup> November 1919. Early members were among the first generation of college-educated women, the first generation of North American women to vote, and a part of the growing, though still comparatively small, legion of women entering the workforce. Today, 97 years later, Zonta is a leading global organization of professionals, empowering women worldwide through service and advocacy with nearly 1,200 clubs and nearly 30,000 members in 66 countries.

Throughout its history, Zonta has provided more than US\$31 million to empower women and expand their access to education, health care, economic opportunities and safe living conditions.

We are grateful to all of our members and supporters who have allowed Zonta to continue its life-changing work for nearly a century.

### **Zonta International responds to appointment of Wonder Woman as UN Honorary Ambassador for Empowerment of Women and Girls**

28 October 2016

Last week, the United Nations announced that Wonder Woman, a fictitious comic character, had been named an Honorary Ambassador for the Empowerment of Women and Girls. This new “ambassador” would be tasked with raising awareness about Sustainable Development Goal 5: Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls.

This appointment was met with disbelief by women’s organizations, UN staff and others. In response, Zonta International President Sonja Hönig Schough sent a letter to Secretary-General Ban Ki-Moon, asking him to reconsider the appointment and to give Goal 5 a serious, real-life role model that can bring the necessary and appropriate attention to Goal No. 5 and global gender equality challenges. Below is an excerpt from President Sonja’s letter to the Secretary-General.

“When we read that Wonder Woman, a fictional character, was appointed by the United Nations as an Honorary Ambassador for the Empowerment of Women and Girls, we thought it was a joke. Unfortunately, we soon discovered it was true. This highly sexualized cartoon, often dressed in parts of the U.S. flag, shall be tasked with raising awareness about Goal No. 5 of the Sustainable Development Goals.

“At a time when issues such as gender parity in senior UN roles and the prevention of sexual exploitation and abuse of women and girls is at the top of the UN agenda, this appointment is an insult to women all over the world and should be an embarrassment for UN leadership. Zonta International asks you to reconsider the appointment of Wonder Woman as the Honorary Ambassador for the empowerment of women and girls. This role is far too important to be filled by a fictitious character. We need a real-life female role model that women and girls around the world can look up to.”
