## 600 birthing kits heading overseas

THE weather was grey and raining, but there were smiles and cheerful conversation aplenty inside the Maleny RSL hall on Saturday August 27, where 18 women were making a difference. The Zonta Club of Blackall Range hosted

their annual Birthing Kit packing morning, putting together 600 kits that will be distributed overseas. These small ziplock bags containing a sheet of plastic, three pieces of string, five swabs, soap, a scalpel blade and sterile gloves significantly improve the health of mothers and babies in countries where women routinely give birth without access to medical care.

"We were thrilled to welcome Club members and local volunteers, including three midwifery students from USC this year," said service committee chair June Robson.
