Another great aspect was that it ran exactly to schedule; not an easy thing to achieve. President Margaret welcomed us all after which Heather, co-chairman of the Service Committee and MC for the day, introduced the first speaker.

**Dr. Bev Kirk** a local Psychologist who dealt with the emotions we might feel - guilt, resentment etc.. when thrust into these situations and one of the things that resonated with me was to always try to "treat the person as you would a friend" - pointing out that you wouldn't show irritability with a friend but you certainly would with a family member!

**Sue Pieters-Hawke** followed and spoke eloquently on the steep learning curve that finding yourself a carer is. She is well-known as the primary carer for her mother, Hazel Hawke, and had a wealth of useful information to share.
