Membership Chair Zoom Meeting

Three members of the Membership committee: Carole Tomvald, Cecil Nielson and I attended the Membership Chair Zoom meeting on 28th October 2024. This was a case study by Trish Collins of the Rockhampton Club as to how they increased their club membership from 10 members in 2022 to 31 members in 2024. Their current membership in October 2024 is 25 members.

They invited prospective members to a function that went for 2 hours where the President welcomed them, and other members shared their
