Dear Dr Ladwig,

I refer to your email of 7 February 2026 to the Honourable Dan Purdie MP, Minister for Police and Emergency Services, regarding the changes to the Domestic Family Violence and Vulnerable Persons Command.

I have been requested to respond to you on behalf of the Minister and sought advice from the Queensland Police Service (QPS) so that our office can be better informed about the issues you have raised.

Domestic and family violence is a serious and complex whole-of-community issue that has a profound impact on the lives of Queenslanders, their families, and the broader community. The QPS remains firmly committed to prioritising domestic and family violence as a core policing responsibility and to delivering an effective frontline response to those experiencing or at risk of harm.

As part of the Commissioner's 100-Day Review of the QPS, the QPS is undertaking a realignment and prioritisation of resources to ensure the Service is best positioned to support frontline policing capability, strengthen operational responsiveness, and maximise community safety outcomes.

The Domestic, Family Violence and Vulnerable Persons Command capability is being elevated to the Office of the Commissioner, reflecting how seriously the QPS takes these issues. A small number of QPS officers who were based in Police Headquarters in Brisbane will be redeployed to Vulnerable Persons Units in police districts across the State to bolster the frontline and better protect victim-survivors.

The QPS will continue to work closely with partner agencies, in building safer communities and with better coordinated responses to domestic and family violence. Support of the sector, our community, victims-survivors and holding perpetrators to account remain priorities for the QPS. This change builds the capability of the Service to engage with the sector and the community to drive positive change.

This Government is committed to ensuring police have the tools to combat domestic and family violence and has implemented a suite of legislative reforms that prioritise victim-survivor safety and hold perpetrators to account. These reforms include the ability to issue Police Protection Directions; enabling the electronic monitoring of high-risk domestic and family violence perpetrators, and the statewide implementation and streamlining of video recorded evidence-in-chief for domestic and family violence matters.
