Help Is On The Way

Townsville medicos, Professor Ajay Rane, Clinical Nurse Audrey Corstiaans and Dr Paul Fladjoe visited India in August 2008 to perform surgery on women with gynaecological problems such as fistulas and prolapses. Their work is giving women who live in outer lying provinces back their lives. These women may even trudge 400-500 klms to receive this treatment. Professor Rane thanked the generosity of North Queenslanders and the Zonta Clubs of North Queensland for making their mission possible. Professor Rane and his team have previously visited Bowen with assistance from several Zonta members. Addressing an enthusiastic crowd of Bowen and Collinsville women they provided information on gynaecological disorders and highlighted their work in under-privileged (Source - Townsville countries. 16.08.2008.)
