With our President Bev busily commuting between Bowen and her work in Mackay, she has asked me to pen a few words on her behalf. On the local scene, Bev has expressed a great desire to see projects related to Bowen's women and children who are in need, come to fruition. I am positive as a club we will come together and support Bev with these worthwhile projects.

Internationally, our Zonta International President Beryl Sten and the board have the women and girls of Haiti on their 2010 agenda. In her email dated 4/2/10, Beryl described the violence they will be at risk of experiencing following the earthquake, when law and order is not functioning. Beryl informed us that discussions have commenced with UNIFEM to organise a project that will be effective once the need for immediate help has decreased. She assured members that as a strategic partner of UNIFEM, Zonta's project will address this issue of violence against Haitian women and girls while meeting Zonta's mission and objects. The Board is recommending a ZISVAW project in support of the women of Haiti and will take this proposed project to the Convention in San Antonio for voting.

It is truly inspiring to know that when women and children are in need of support, be they in our hometown or a world away in another country, Zonta members will be moved into action.

## Inspiring Women

Zonta International president Beryl Sten proudly emailed (dated 05.02.10) all Zontians with exciting news regarding Amelia Earhart Fellow (1994-1995), **Naoko Yamazaki**. The Amelia Earhart Fellowship Fund provides financial assistance to women who are pursuing PhD /doctoral degrees in aerospace-related science and engineering.

Naoko Yamazaki who was born on December 27, 1970 is a Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency (JAXA) astronaut. She is the second Japanese woman to qualify as an astronaut, the first being Chiaki Mukai who became a Zonta International Honorary Member in 2000.

Naoko joined NASA's Astronaut Candidate Training in June 2004. On the 18<sup>th</sup> March 2010 she will join the crew of the Atlantis, as a Japanese crew member. Lifting off from Houston for a two-week flight, they will deliver equipment and materials to the International Space Station and Naoko will be the astronaut responsible for operating a robotic arm. Beryl commented that Naoko and her story is just one of many of the successes of our Amelia Earhart Fellows.

## Toothbrushes for Timor

Association The of Women Educators (www.awe.asn.au) recently returned from a study tour hosted by Ms. Kirsty Sword Gusmo (Alola Foundation). Timor-Leste is only a 45 minute plane ride from Darwin and the aim of the study tour was to identify ways to assist the Alola Foundation (www.alolafoundation.org/) to support education especially of the women and girls. One of these is developing a campaign to collect basic personal hygiene items (toothbrushes, toothpaste, soap, shampoo, brushes & combs) as many families presently share (1) toothbrush and have little access to other items essential to good health. Rotary District 9800 has agreed to transport collected items. The Alola Foundation is conducting health education programmes through the schools and items will be distributed as part of this programme.


