# Technology Saving Lives

Hearts of Purple is a volunteer run charity in Queensland assisting survivors of domestic violence. Perpetrators often break or disable their victim's mobile, leaving the victim unable to call for help. To combat this, the charity provides a Tek Safe Wearable Duress Alarm watch to their clients at high risk of being killed. The watch is supported by a 24/7 moitoring centre that tracks imcoming alerts and responds with sensitivity.



## Grant Application - Runaway Police Station Soft Room

We are thrilled to announce that our recent grant application has been approved!

After enduring quite a lengthy process applying for a grant for the Runaway Police Station Soft Room we received a letter from the Minister for the Prevention of Domestic and Family Violence, the Attorney-General, Yvette D'Ath MP, approving our application.

The grant, generously provided by the Gambling Community Benefit Fund (GCBF), will enable us to further our mission supporting and uplifting our community through innovative projects and programs. This initiative is a testament to our dedication to creating positive change and fostering a stronger, more resilient community for all.

We are grateful for the support and confidence shown by the GCBF in our vision and commitment to making a difference. This grant will not only allow us to expand our reach and impact but also to engage more deeply with community members and create lasting, meaningful change.

The grant funding will cover the renovation of a soft room at the Runaway Bay Police Station.

It has been evidenced that these soft rooms provide an environment supportive for women and their children during police interviews in relation to domestic and family violence and other sensitive matters. It is our aim to create a space where women and children feel safe, acknowledged, respected and empowered during their interations at the Police Sation. Furthermore, an holistic approach will contribute to building trust, encouraging open communication, and ultimately enhancing the effectiveness of investigations and better outcomes for women and children.

We believe that by creating a safe and nurturing envioroment in what may generally be perceived as a harsh and unforgiving police station, this space will alleviate a significant portion of the distress associated with such interviews and provide crucial support for vulnerable women and children living through traumatic circumstances. Currently, the existing interview room lacks the necessary elements to create a safe and calming atmosphere for these individuals, hindering their ability to feel able to share necessare information confidently. The funding will have profound impact on the safety, well-being and empowerment of women and their children as they navigate the difficult and traumatising process of police interviews.

Thank you to all who have been involved in this process for their invaluable support. Together, we can continue to drive positive change and build a brighter future for our community.

### **Zonta International Conference Report**

#### Overview

The Zonta International Conference was a remarkable event marked by inspiration, information, and excellent organization. The conference featured a fabulous keynote speaker, Rabia Siddique, alongside other notable presentations and workshops. The event underscored Zonta's strategic plans and accomplishments, emphasizing its ongoing commitment to empowering women globally.

### Keynote Speaker: Rabia Siddique

Rabia Siddique, an Australian and retired British Army Senior Officer, delivered an inspiring keynote address. Siddique, an international humanitarian lawyer and survivor of hostage situations and abuse, shared her compelling journey detailed in her bestselling memoir, Equal Justice: My Journey as a Woman, a Soldier, and a Muslim. Her story resonated deeply with the audience, highlighting themes of resilience, justice, and empowerment.

### Notable Presentation by Woman in STEM recipient

Shayna Spencer: The District 22 Woman in STEM Scholarship recipient spoke at the opening ceremony. Spencer, a mechanical engineering student at Griffith University, outlined how the scholarship significantly assisted her academic and professional journey. She confidently spoke about her upcoming project in Singapore, serving as a testament to the impactful support provided by Zonta's awards.

Shayna will be heading to Singapore in December this year as part of a New Colombo Plan Scholarship (offered by the Australian Government). As part of this scholarship program, she will complete her final year of university at Nanyang Technological University in Singapore, complete an internship, and undertake language training in Mandarin. She will be in Singapore for roughly one year, and following that, she will spend a few months in Thailand interning as well.

#### Strategic Plan 2024-26

During the conference, attendees gained a comprehensive understanding of Zonta's Strategic Plan for 2024-26. Key points included:

- Funding and Projects: Zonta has successfully raised funds over the past two years to support projects for the 2024-25 biennium. The three main projects adopted for this period are:
  - Ending Child Marriage: Accelerating global action Phase III.
  - Climate Empower: Community empowerment and innovation for gender-transformative climate action.
  - LAAHA: A virtual safe space for women and girls.

## Education Programs 2024-26 funded through the ROSE Foundation or the Amelia Earhart Fellowship Endowment Fund

Zonta continues to champion education through various scholarships and awards:

- · Amelia Earhart Fellowship
- Women in Business Scholarship: 37 scholarships of \$5,000 each, awarded in year 1 or 2.
- Women in Business Leadership Award: 10 awards of \$10,000 each.
- Zonta Women in STEM Award: 16 awards of \$10,000 each.
- Young Women in Public Affairs Award: 37 awards of \$5,000 each, awarded in both years.


#### Workshops - more detail of learnings in future meetings/newletters
