Zonta International District 22 Extract from July District 22 Newsletter

The month of July begins with NAIDOC week celebrations around Australia including many programs being run by national media stations. The theme for 2023 is "For our Elders". All Zonta Clubs in District 22 acknowledge the local first nations peoples, recognising their contribution to history, culture and achievements of first nations peoples. But do we know what the acronym NAIDOC represents?

Before the 1920s, Aboriginal rights groups boycotted Australia Day (26 January) in protest against the status and treatment of Indigenous Australians. By the 1920s, they were increasingly aware that the broader Australian public were largely ignorant of the boycotts. If the movement were to make progress, it would need to be active. In 1956, major Aboriginal organisations, state and federal governments, all supported the formation of, the National Aborigines Day Observance Committee (NADOC). At the same time, the second Sunday in July became a day of remembrance for Aboriginal people and their heritage. Forward to 1991, with a growing awareness of the distinct cultural histories of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, NADOC was expanded to recognise Torres Strait Islander people and culture. The committee then became known as the National Aborigines and Islanders Day Observance Committee (NAIDOC). This new name has become the title for the whole week, not just the day. The National NAIDOC Committee respectfully acknowledges the now defunct and inaccurate term 'Aborigines', whilst retaining the term in the title due to historic use by Elders in establishing this week of commemoration in 1938.
