



Her artwork incorporates unity, creating a sense of harmony, peace, honesty and wholeness by using similar elements and placing them in a way that creates a feeling of "oneness." Women being the symbol of life. The mahogany and gold reflect the colours of Autumn (and Zonta).

It is a vibrant painting with an Aboriginal perspective. Title of painting is 'Connected' 'United Dreaming Story'. Painted: May 2024

Artist: Patricia Tyson, 66 years old.

Patricia was born in a small town called Goodooga, near the town of Lightning Ridge, in Central West NSW, Australia, where beautiful opals are found, which are the national stone emblem of Australia.

She belongs to the Aboriginal Kamilaroi tribe and currently resides in Banora Point New South Wales, Australia.

Size: approx. 70cm X 50cm Acrylic on unstretched canvas, not framed

Convention Keynote speakers:

Rabia Siddique - Australian criminal and human rights lawyer, retired British Army officer, author, professional speaker and hostage survivor. Rabia sued the British Government for sexism and racism – this was a catalyst for policy change for fairer workplace for women and cultural minorities in the British military. Rabia is a sought-after coach and mentor. She has provided equality and diversity training at the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst. Her first book is Equal Justice.

Lisa Blair - First woman to sail solo around Antarctica with one stop after surviving a dramatic dismasting at sea. Her yacht named Climate Action Now – this reflects her commitment to a sustainable future and inspired others to act through her post-it note campaign.

She has continued to amplify her message of Climate Action Now and collaborated with the Bureau of Meteorology, the Australian Institute of Marine Science, and the Seabed 2030 project. In partnership with Ocean Ops, Lisa's expedition to collect round-the-clock ocean health readings and gather 180 microplastic samples, earned recognition as a United Nations Decade of Ocean Science initiative. Author of Facing Fear, and Speaker on Resilience and Mental Agility.
