## United Nations Women District Committee

For the first time an International Day of Women and Girls is celebrated on 11th February 2017.

UN Chair Bridget Mather writes:

"Science and gender equality are both vital for the achievement of the internationally agreed development goals, including the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. Over the past 15 years, the global community has made a lot of effort in inspiring and engaging women and girls in science. Unfortunately, women and girls continued to be excluded from participating fully in science, according to a study conducted in 14 countries, the probability for female students of graduating with a Bachelor's degree, Master's degree

and Doctor's degree in science - related field are 18 percent, 8 percent respectively, while the percentages of male students are 37 percent, 18 percent and 6 percent.

In order to achieve full and equal access to and participation in science for women and girls, and further achieve gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls, the UN General Assembly adopted the resolution to have The International day of Women and Girls in Science."

## PERSON OF INTEREST

### *Glenda Fay Moor*



**Born:** in Brisbane in 1952, and grew up in the bayside suburb of Wynnum with my six siblings (three brothers and three sisters – five of whom are still alive and well).

Dad was an Ambulance officer and mum was left home to raise the family and do the never-ending piles of washing and ironing. Looking back, we had a safe and happy upbringing with no luxuries around the home which was a typical family growing up in the 50s and 60s.

At school, I always liked to do well and so I continued onto Teachers College in Kelvin Grove, graduating in 1971 as a Commerce Teacher after only 2 years of training.

**Working History:** My first posting at the age of nineteen was to Murgon. I thought I was going away forever and cried bucket loads when the family

came to see me off on the Greyhound bus - bound for the bush. What a surprise everyone got when four days later I arrived home for the long weekend!

By Easter of that year I was transferred to another faraway place: Miriam Vale which is near Gladstone. This time, when it was time to head home, I hitched a ride with a handsome young blonde teacher who was the teddy bear teaching Year Threes.

**Family Journey:** I got engaged to the big bear at the end of that year, and the Education Dept decided our romance was a bit much for Miriam Vale, so Geoff was transferred to Mount Larcom. At the end of the second year we were thankfully, transferred back to Brisbane (together). We were married in Albert Street Methodist Church in the December of 1973. Our daughter Amber, was born in February 1977 and I went back to work full time when she was only 6 weeks old. In the same year, our father ended his own life at the age of 56. This was a very sad time for our family.

I taught in Holland Park SHS, Mansfield SHS and finally Kingston SHS before resigning after the birth of my second child – Ryan, born in Kilcoy hospital, in 1980. I went back to work four years later after completing a Bachelor of Education externally.

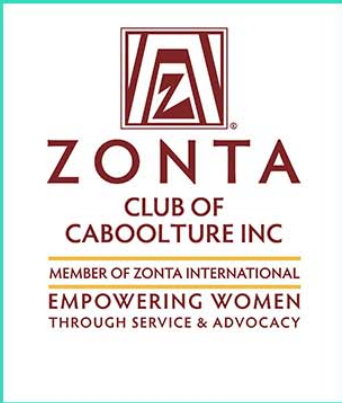
**Where I have lived:** Since leaving home at the age of 18, I have moved 15 times! After twenty-nine years of service in State Education (and I have a medal to prove it), I left it 10 years ago. Since then I have been a part-time Business and Computing teacher at Mueller College, Rothwell and then the last 5 years doing some relief teaching. Slowing down at last (or so I thought)!

**Countries visited:** USA, England, Scotland, NZ – wish it were more!

**I joined Zonta** on the invitation from Patricia Clunes whom I have known since the days when I was teaching with her husband Neil who was the Principal of Bribie Island State High School. When I heard about the projects that were being done by this club, I thought "Yes, this is for me".

**Something you didn't know about me....** I spent my 10<sup>th</sup> birthday in hospital with a fractured skull because I was involved in an accident at a level crossing involving a bus, a train and me on a bike (and I survived!)
