#### **Honouring Trailblazing Women**

At our February meeting, the Zonta Club of Paradise Point recognised the remarkable Amelia Earhart, a pioneering aviator and former Zonta member, by engaging in a fun and educational quiz about her extraordinary life and aviation feats. As we reflected on her courage and ground breaking achievements, we reaffirmed Zonta's commitment to supporting women in STEM and leadership.

The evening also included a special toast to Theresa Mitchell, an inspiring local Woman of Achievement and Founder of AGAPE Outreach. Since 2009, AGAPE Outreach has provided vital support for the homeless and disadvantaged in Tweed Heads and Runaway Bay, with a dedicated team of 200 volunteers and four employees. Inspired by Mother Teresa's words, AGAPE works to combat not just physical poverty but also the poverty of being unloved and uncared for.



On an international scale, we also joined in the "Raise Your Glass" tribute to Joanna Maranhão, an Olympian and advocate who has courageously spoken out against abuse in sports. Meeting with Lynne Foley OAM on the Remarkable Women, Powerful Stories podcast, Joanna shared her journey of survival, advocacy, and justice, inspiring others to find their voices and stand up for change.

This meeting was a powerful reminder of the strength, resilience, and impact of women—past and present—who break barriers, uplift others, and fight for justice.

The February meeting also confirmed the club's 2025 Strategic Plan.

## **Runaway Bay Police Station - Soft Room**





8 March 2025

Each year on 8 March, the global community celebrates International Women's Day, recognizing women for their achievements regardless of national, ethnic, linguistic, economic or political divisions. The Zonta International community also celebrates Zonta Rose Day on 8 March, a time to reflect and give tribute to the women who have empowered us.

#### For ALL women and girls: Rights. Equality. Empowerment

On 8 March 2025, join us to celebrate International Women's Day under the theme, "For ALL women and girls: Rights. Equality. Empowerment."

This year's theme calls for action that can unlock equal rights, power and opportunities for all and a feminist future where no one is left behind. Central to this vision is empowering the next generation—youth, particularly young women and adolescent girls—as catalysts for lasting change.

Besides, the year 2025 is a pivotal moment as it marks the 30th anniversary of the <u>Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action</u>. This document is the most progressive and widely endorsed blueprint for women's and girls' rights worldwide that transformed the women's rights agenda in terms of legal protection, access to services, youth engagement, and change in social norms, stereotypes and ideas stuck in the past.

Engage media, corporate leaders, governments, community leaders, civil society and youth, and others with influence to take action in your communities. Ask leaders to take action and invest in promoting women's rights and gender equality. Sharyn is not only an amazing business owner but an incredible woman that volunteers and constantly gives her time to the community. She was awarded the Paul Harris award for creating and her leadership in <u>Water for the West</u> and became the Hope Island Rotarian of the Year in 2020.



## Women of Note: Adrijana Hanušić Bećirović

Adrijana Hanušić Bećirović has contributed to significant changes in laws, policies and judicial practices during her 15 years of professional and volunteer experience. One of the most notable achievements has been the establishment of the practice of awarding compensation to victims of conflict-related sexual violence in criminal proceedings in Bosnia and Herzegovina. She has also been involved in key strategic human rights litigation, achieving important national and international outcomes.

Adrijana has authored and edited numerous publications in those fields and has contributed to the development of key international guidelines, including the UK Government's PSVI protocol on the documentation and investigation of conflict-related sexual violence, principles on preventing and addressing the stigma associated with those crimes and the Murad Code.

Adrijana met with Lynne Foley OAM, host of the Remarkable Women, Powerful Stories podcast, to share her story as a refugee during the Bosnian War and highlight the significance of every person's story in the pursuit of justice. As a dedicated human rights lawyer and activist, she illuminates the hidden narratives of war crimes and passionately fights for a secure future for all.

From 26 May 2025, coersive control will be a criminal offence in Queensland.

It will be illegal for an adult to use abusive behaviours towards their current, or former, intimate partner, family member, or informal (unpaid) carer with the intention to control or coerce them.


